Complimentary Guest Parking Options

1. Department Reserved Space – managed by administrative staff
2. Monarch Pass – paper hang tags (25 for \$150) – single day use only
3. Validation Code with Off-Street (replaces MobilePay validations)
 - \$125 annual fee per code type plus:
 - Quarterly billing based on validation use
 - 2 hours parking for \$2 per use
 - 4 hours parking for \$4 per use
 - All day parking for \$6 per use

Parking Validations with Off-Street

- Validations or registrations with License Plate Recognition
 - All five parking garages
 - Lot 43 (43rd and Powhatan Ave)
 - Virtual – no customer account required
 - No credit card information required
- Smart-phone with QR code for use on-site
- Can be emailed in advance

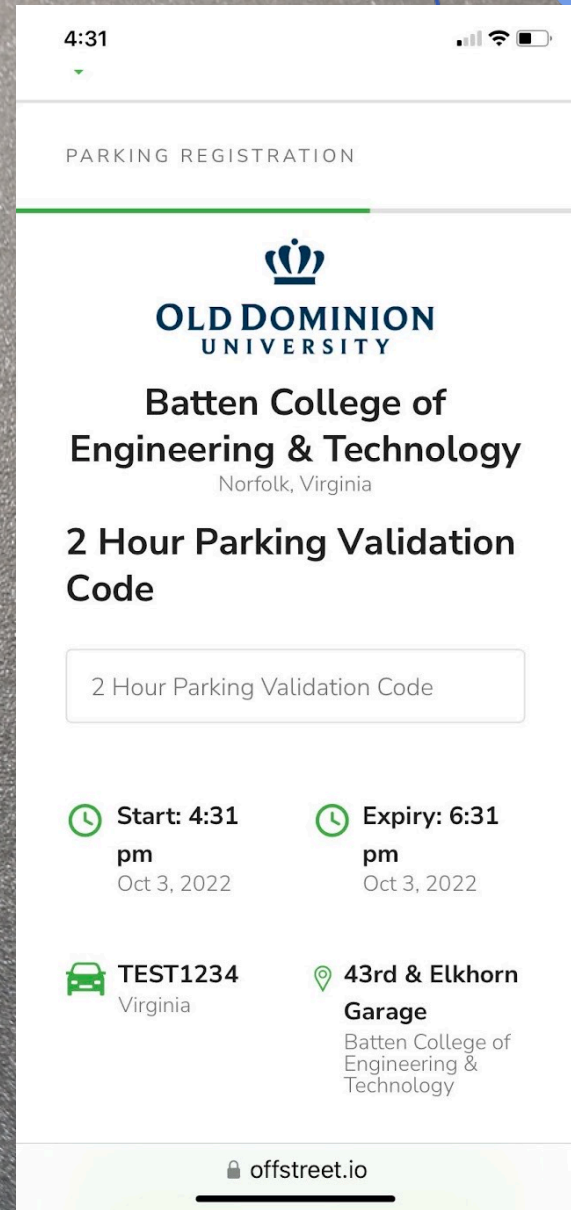

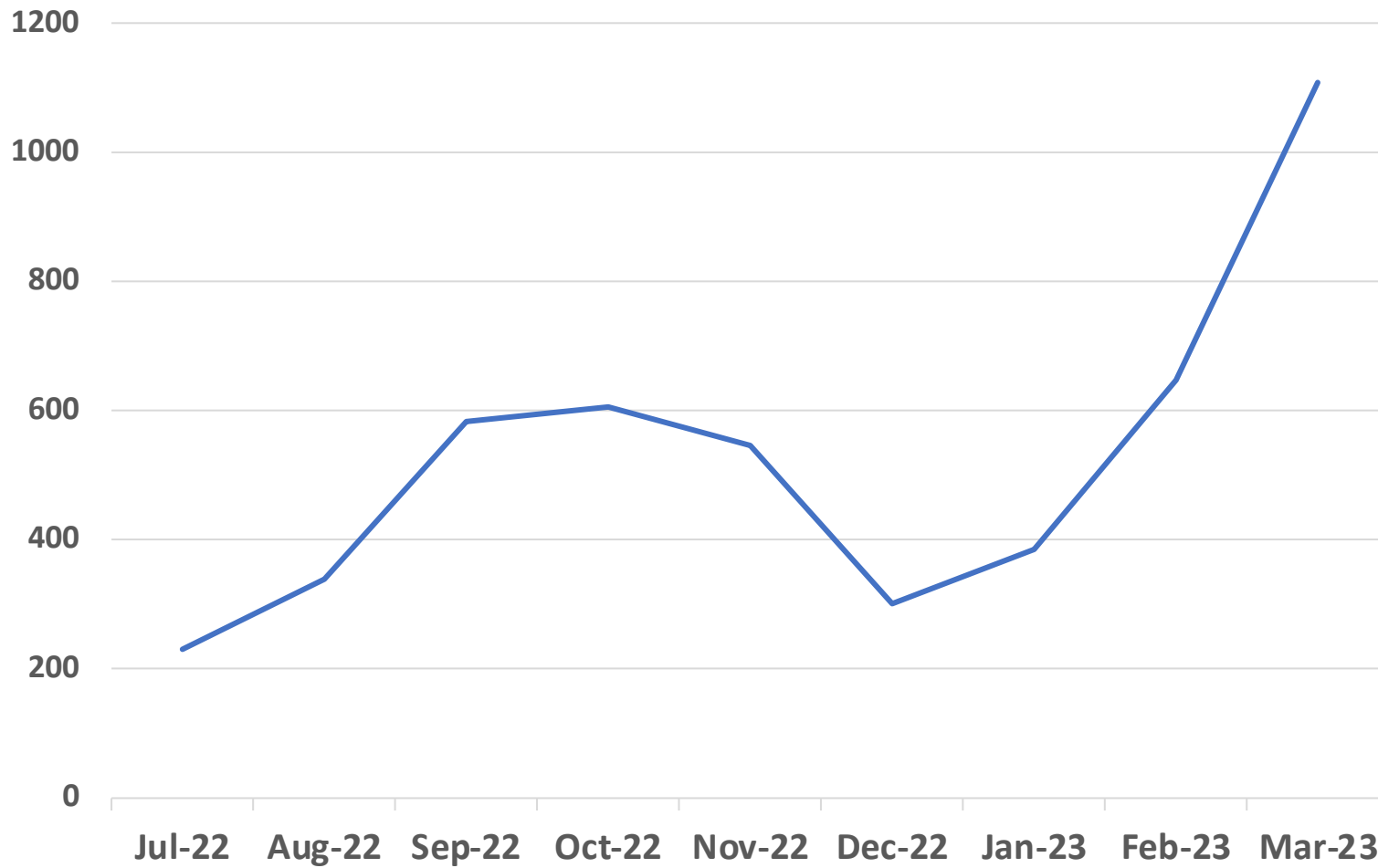


Validation Code with Off-Street

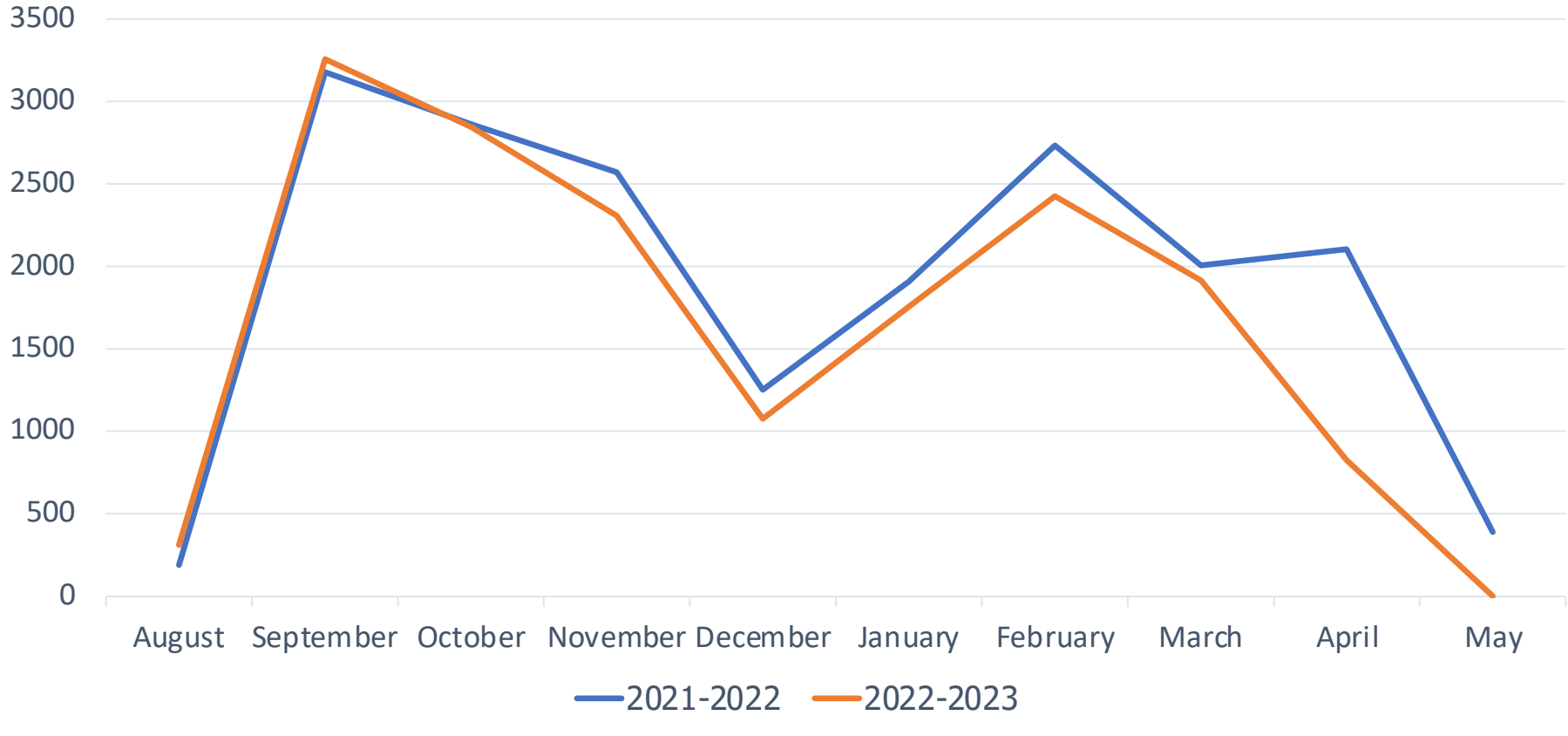

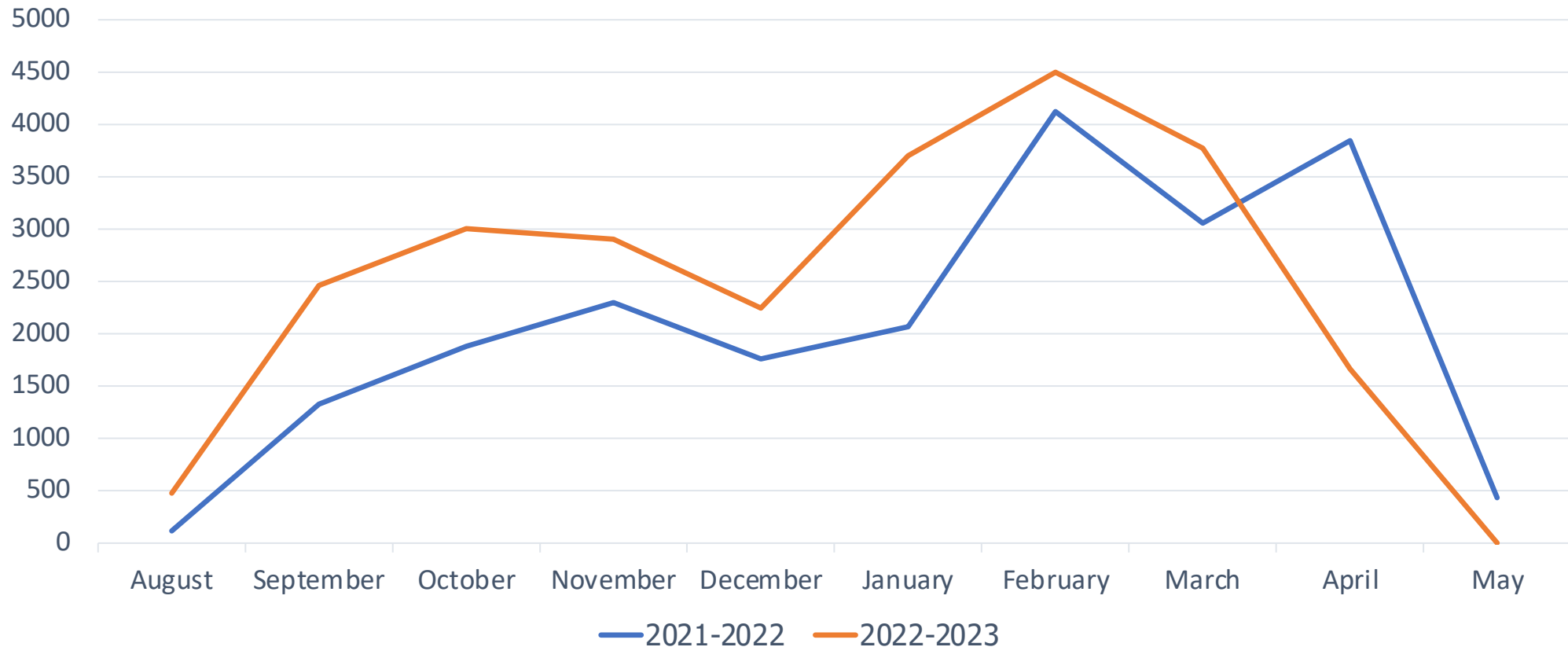

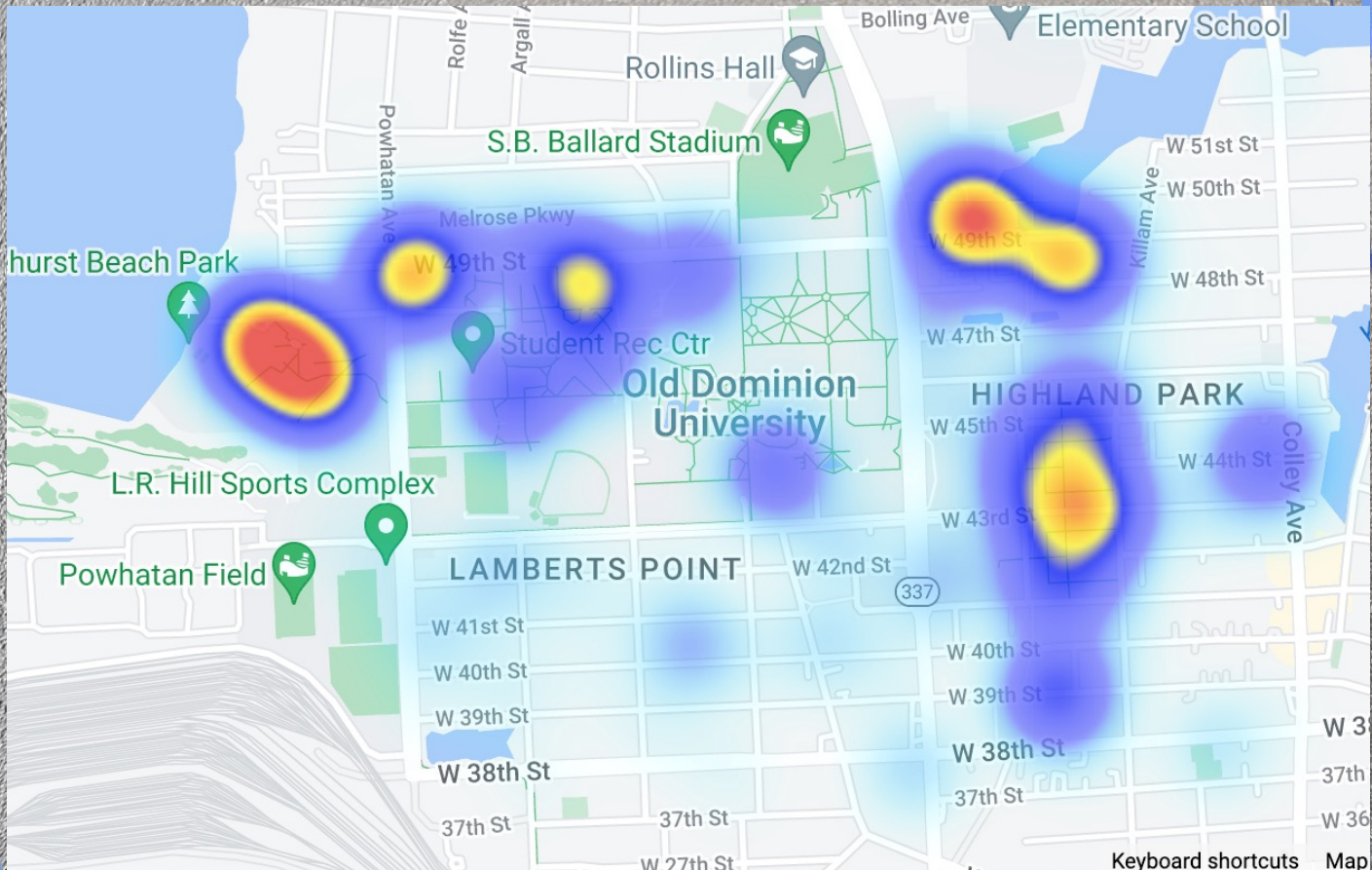

Monthly Safe Ride Ridership FY22 vs FY23

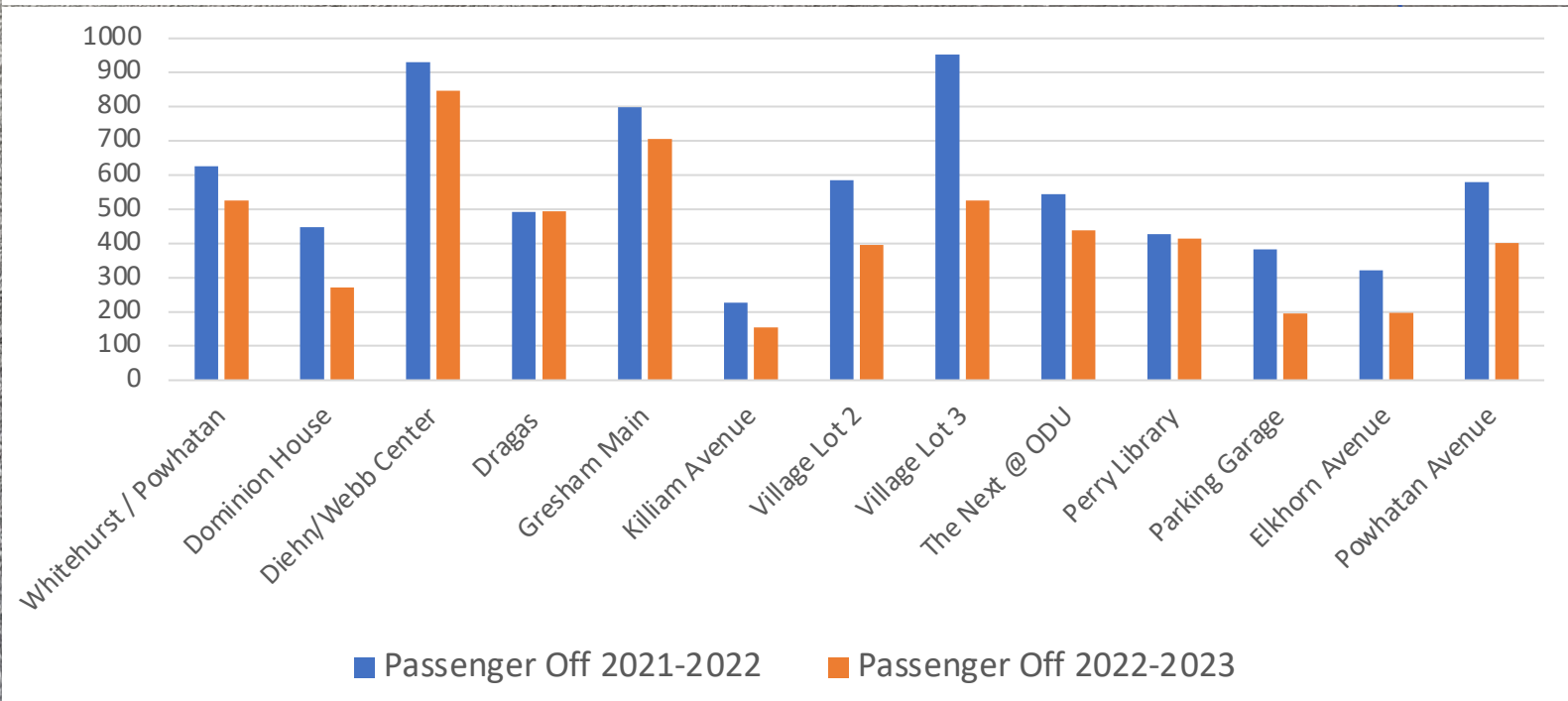
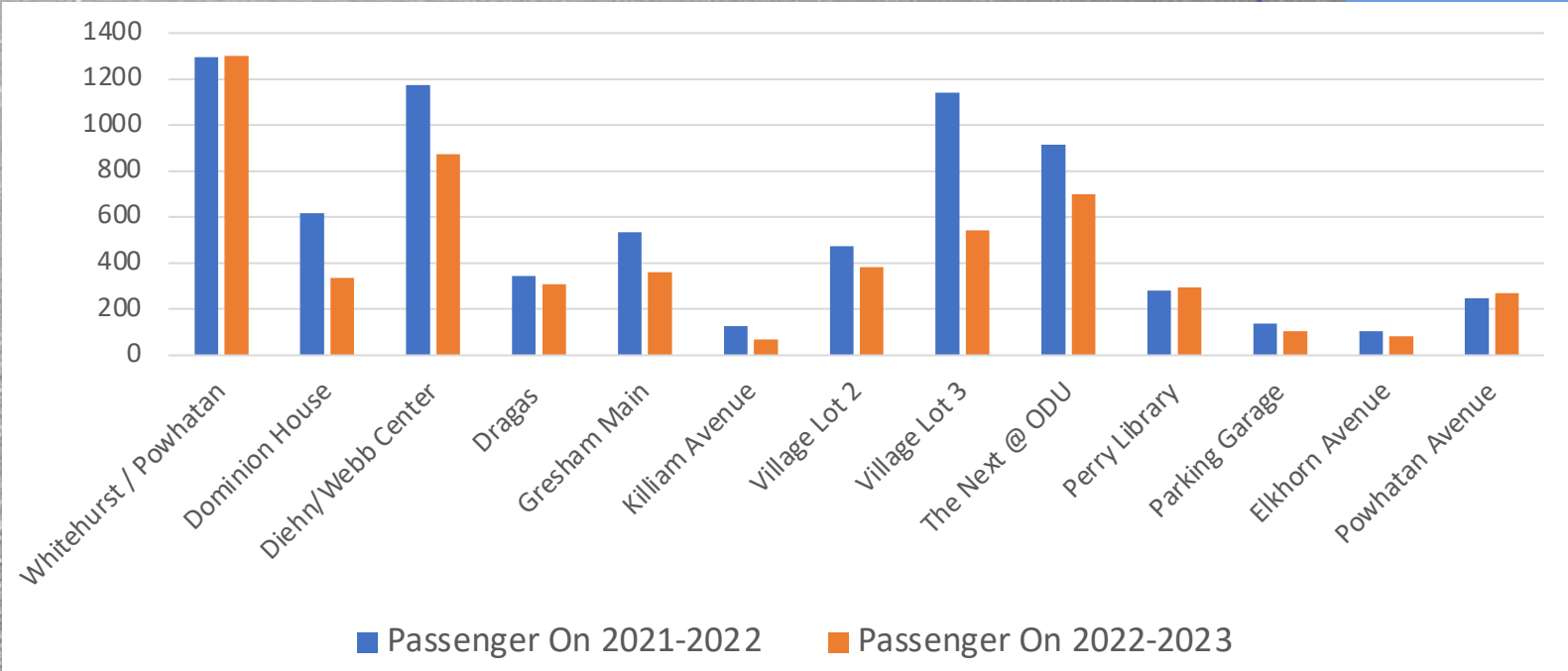




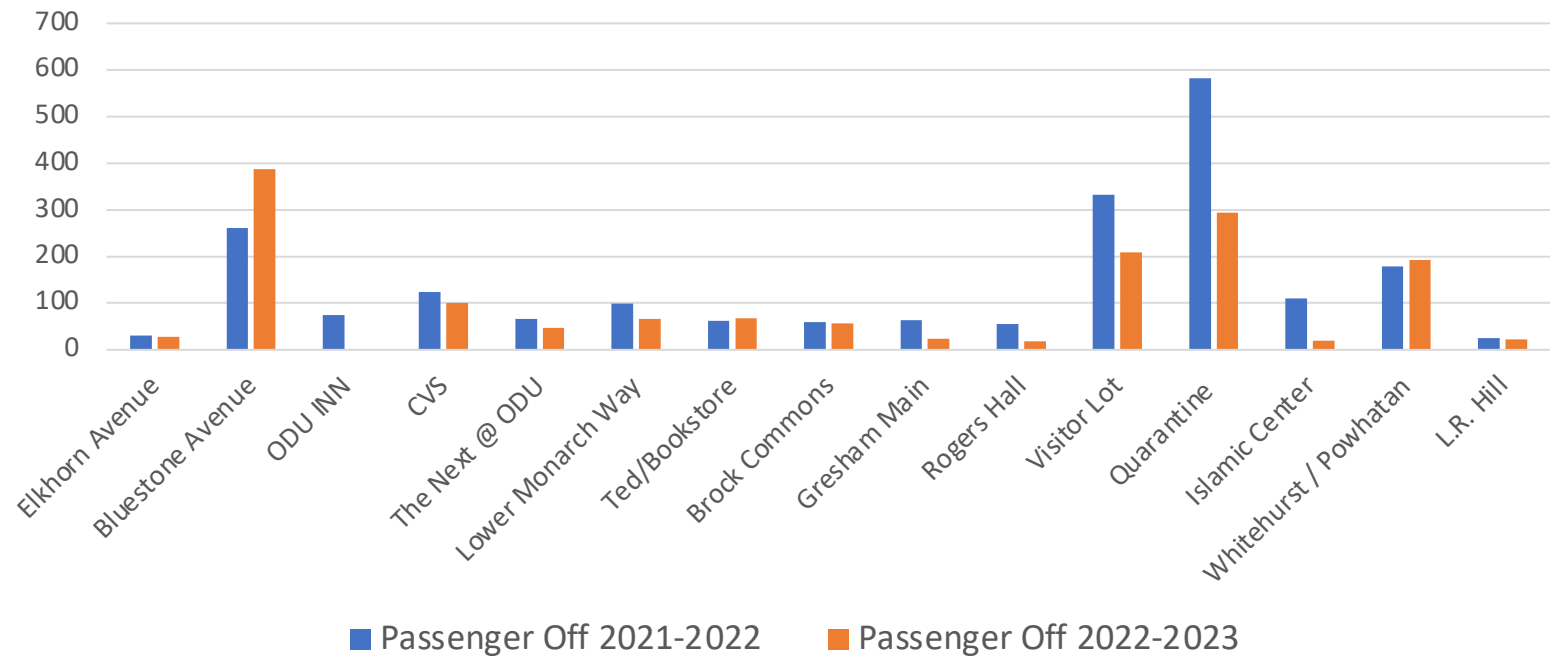
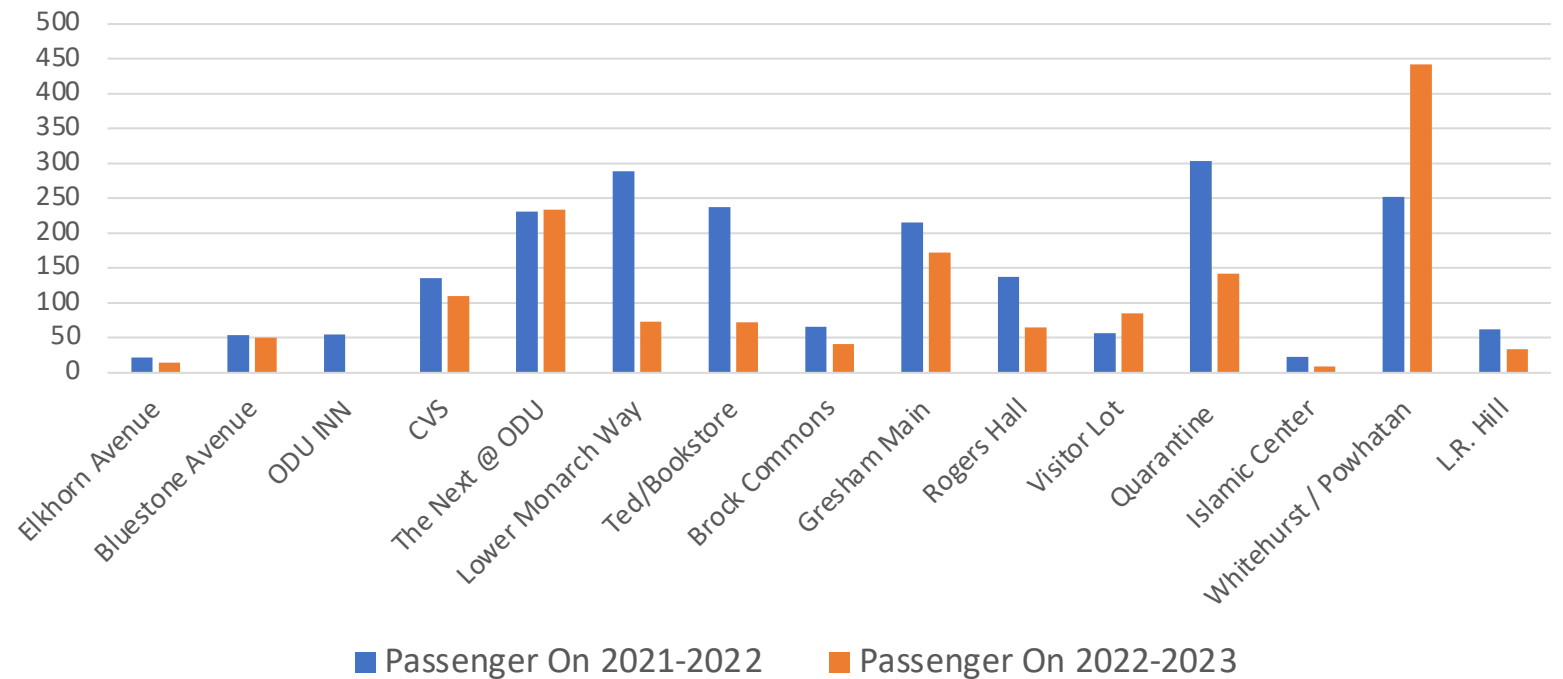
SafeRide Ridership Heat Map through April 15



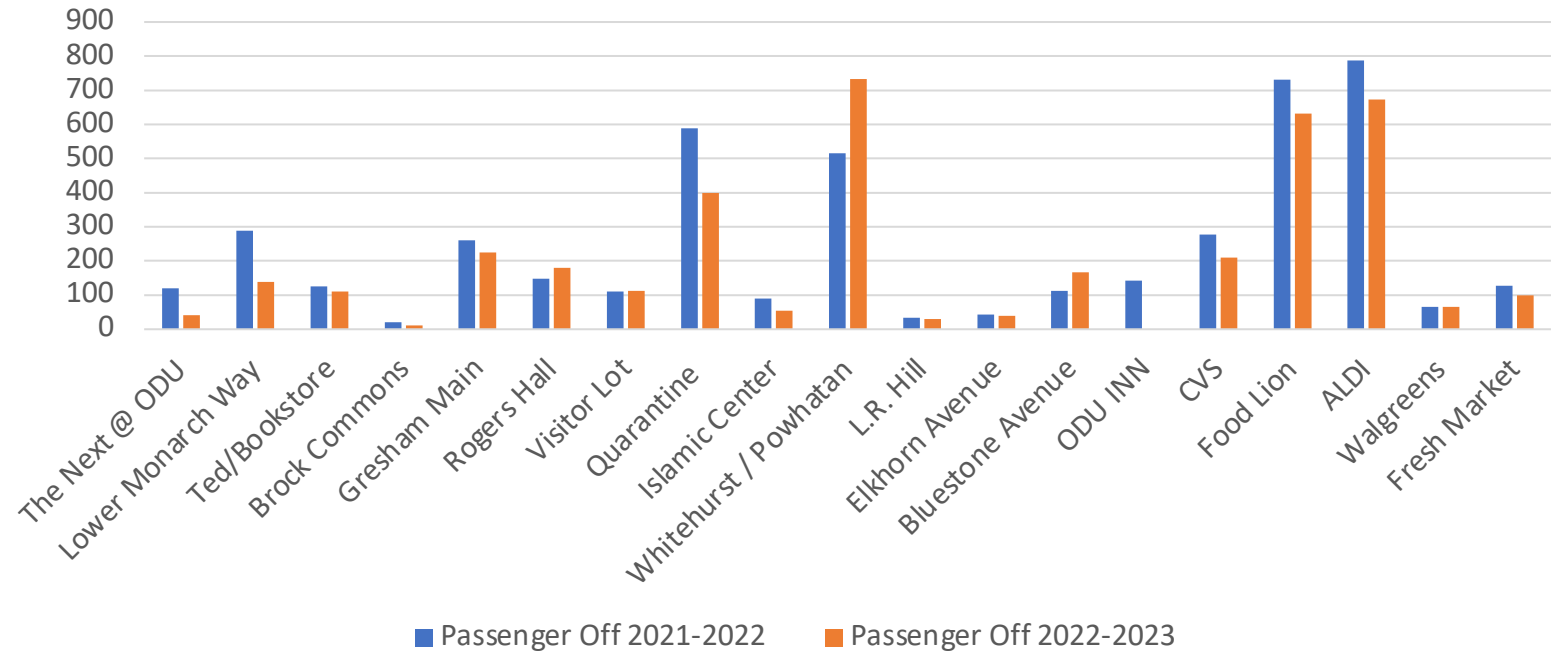
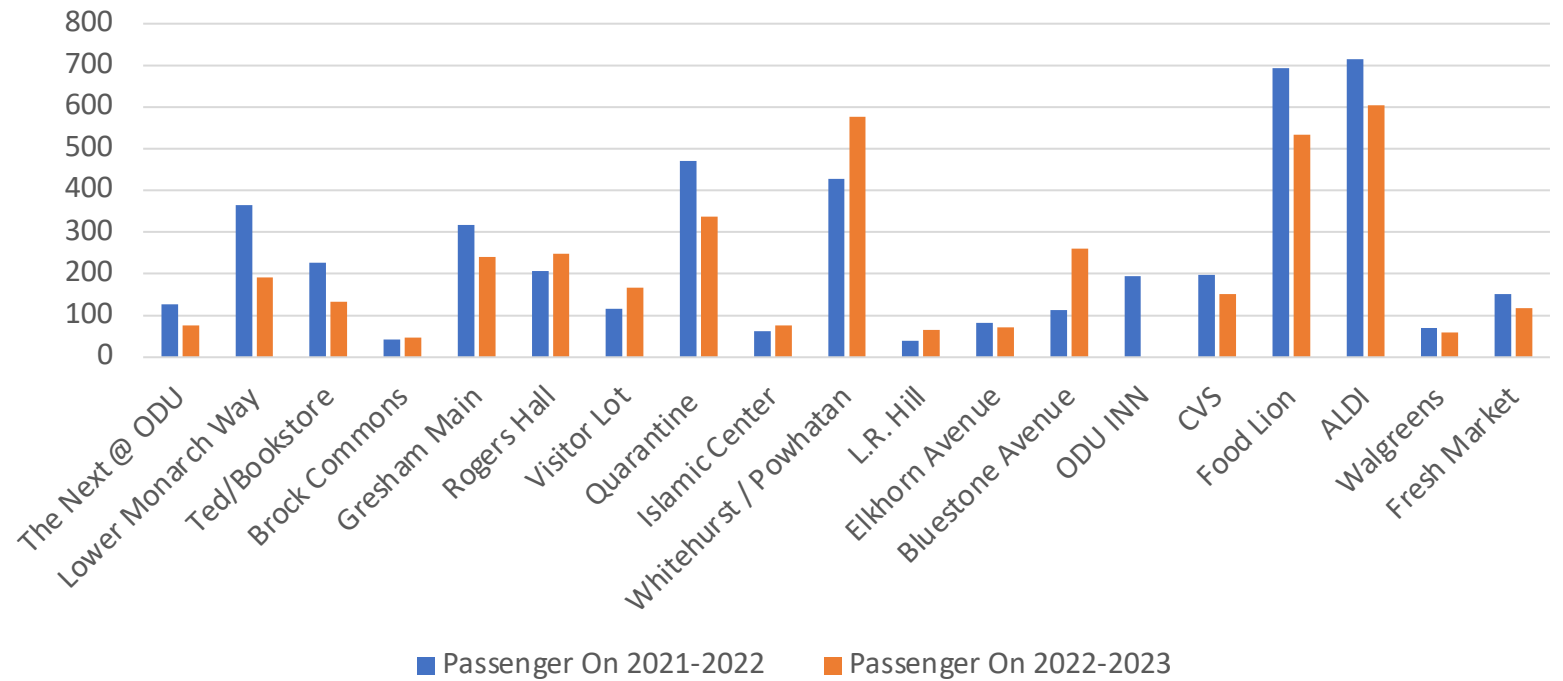
Shuttles: Blue Route Clockwise Circulator



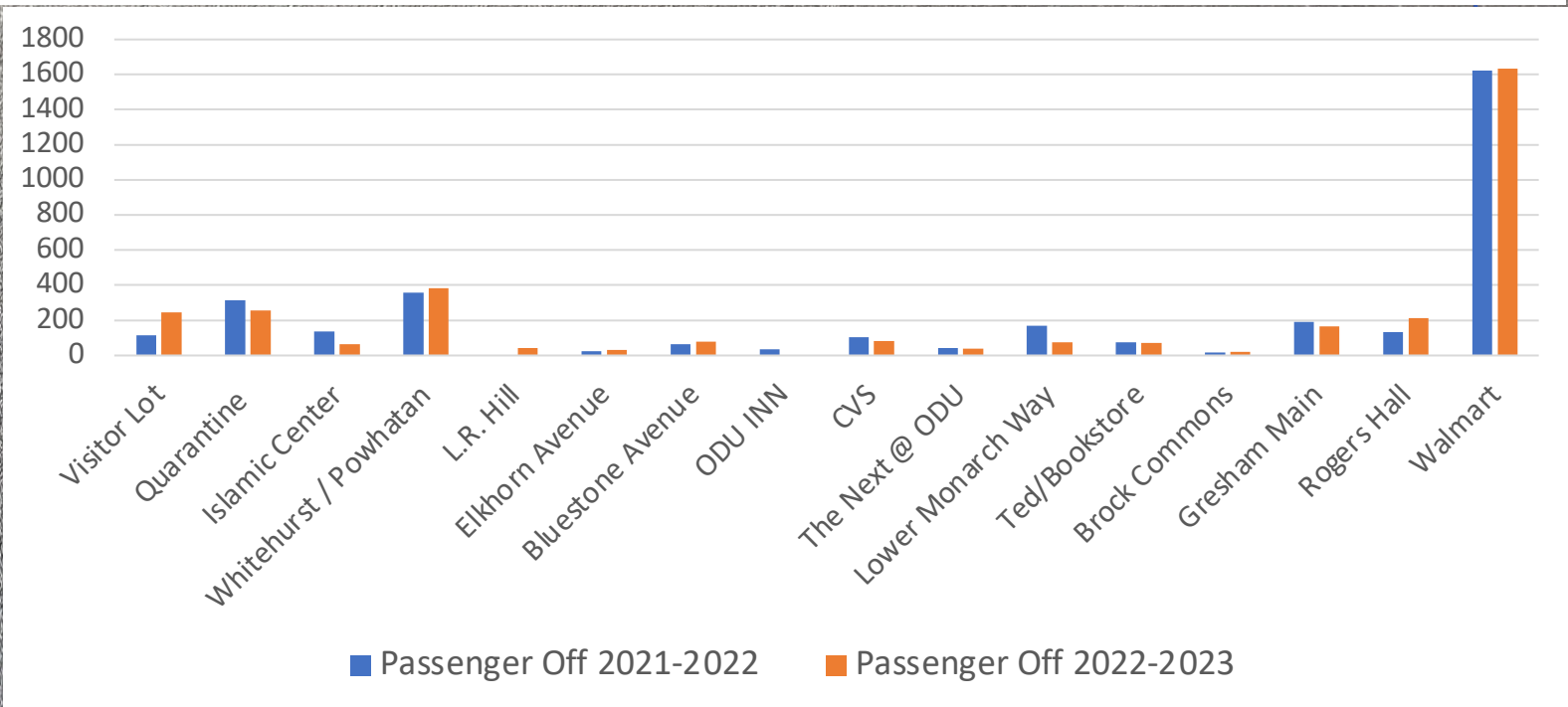
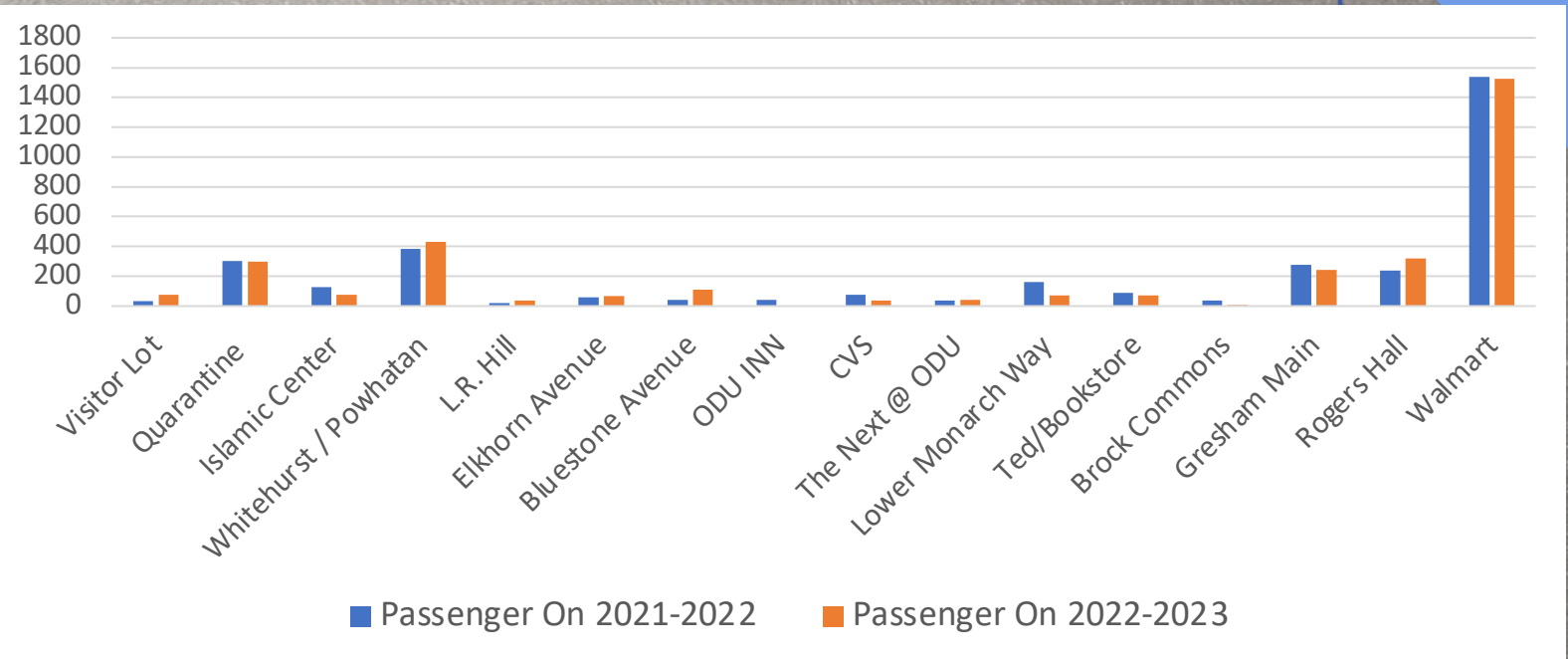
Shuttles: Silver Route Counter- Clockwise Circulator

Pros:

- Service layout provides good access to entire campus and student-oriented destinations off-campus
- Bi-directional circulator increases availability of cross-campus trips
- Consistent operations provide ease of use and reliable level of service

Shuttle Transportation Summary



Cons:

- Overall low ridership on the shuttles for service provided
- Aging fleet of vehicles requires replacement
- Other available modes (scooters, e-bikes) may have eroded ridership base
- Staffing challenges due to Commercial Driver's License (CDL) requirement for shuttle bus operators

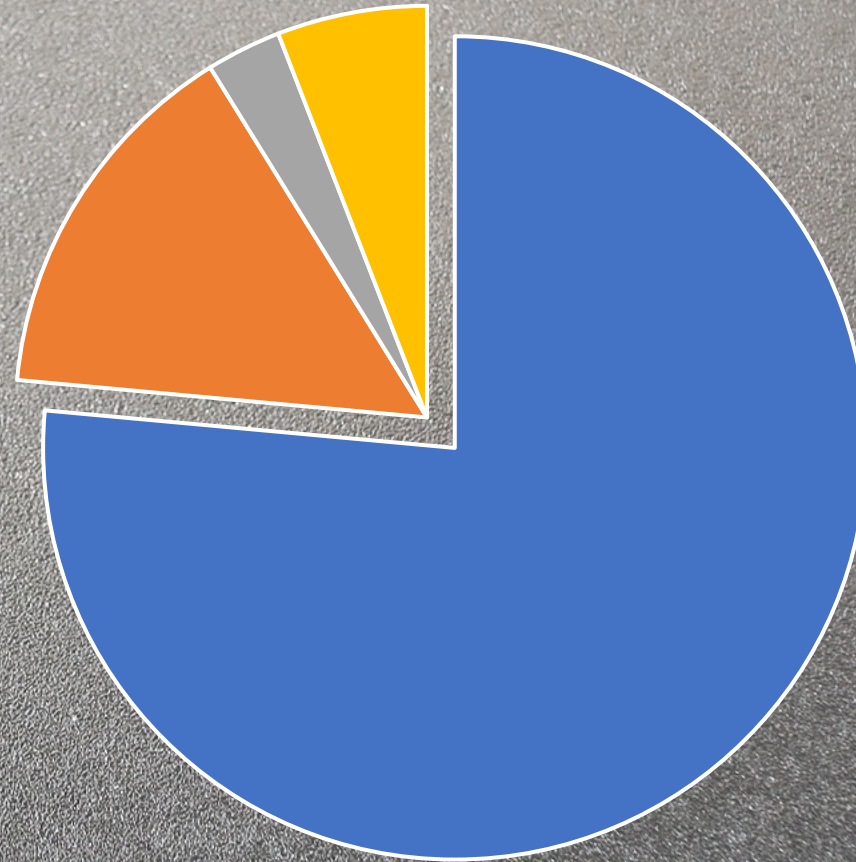


Electric Vehicle Owners' Survey

- 36 responses received, with 16 comments



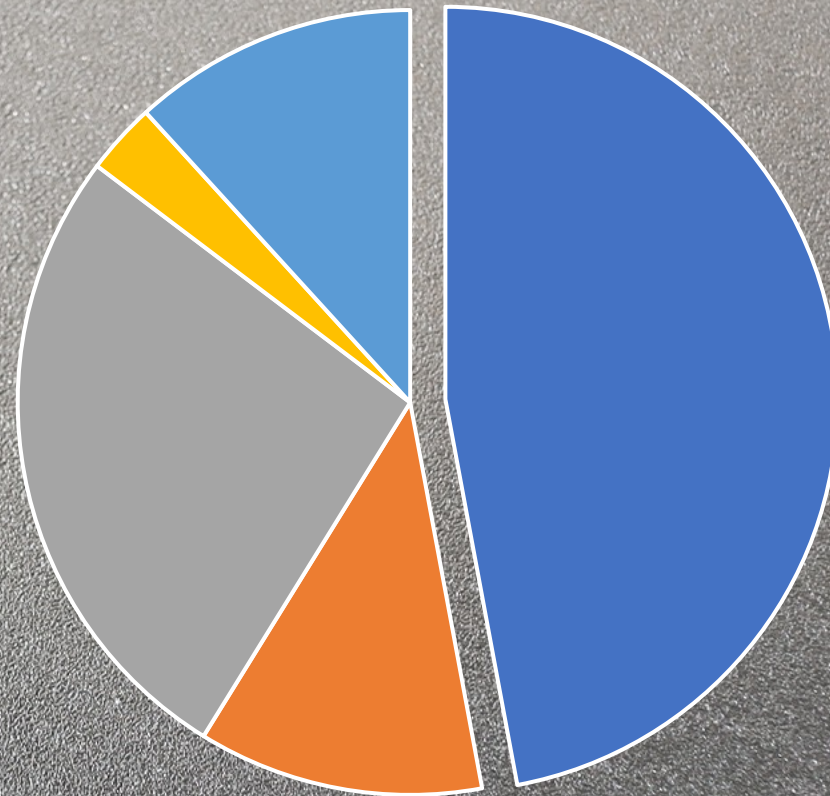
What is your PRIMARY Source of Charging?

■ Public Level 2 Charger

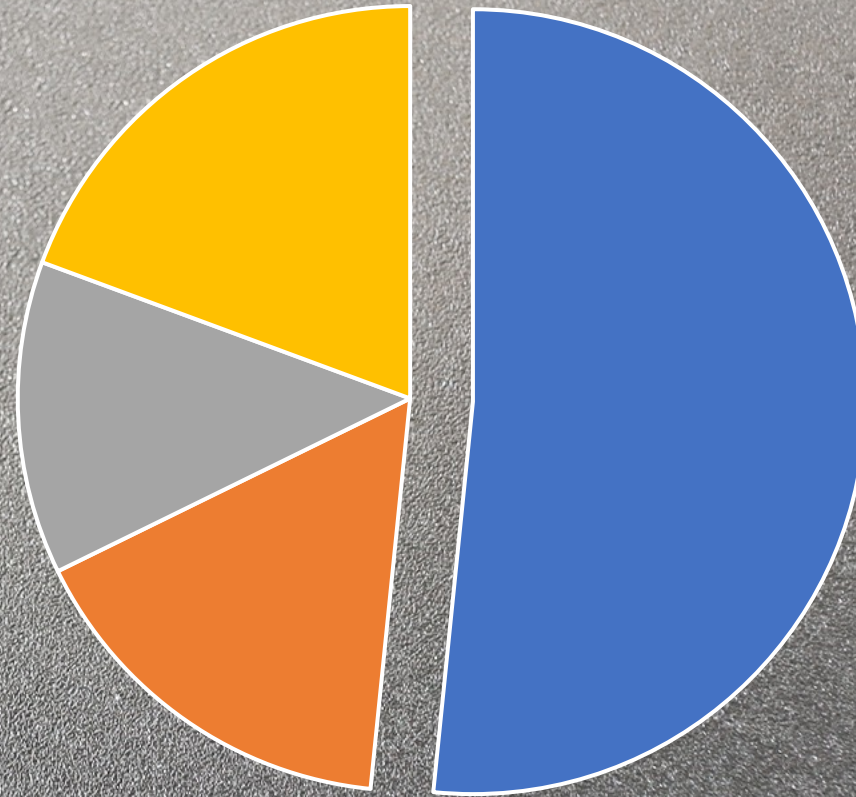
■ At Home Level 1

How many days per week on campus?



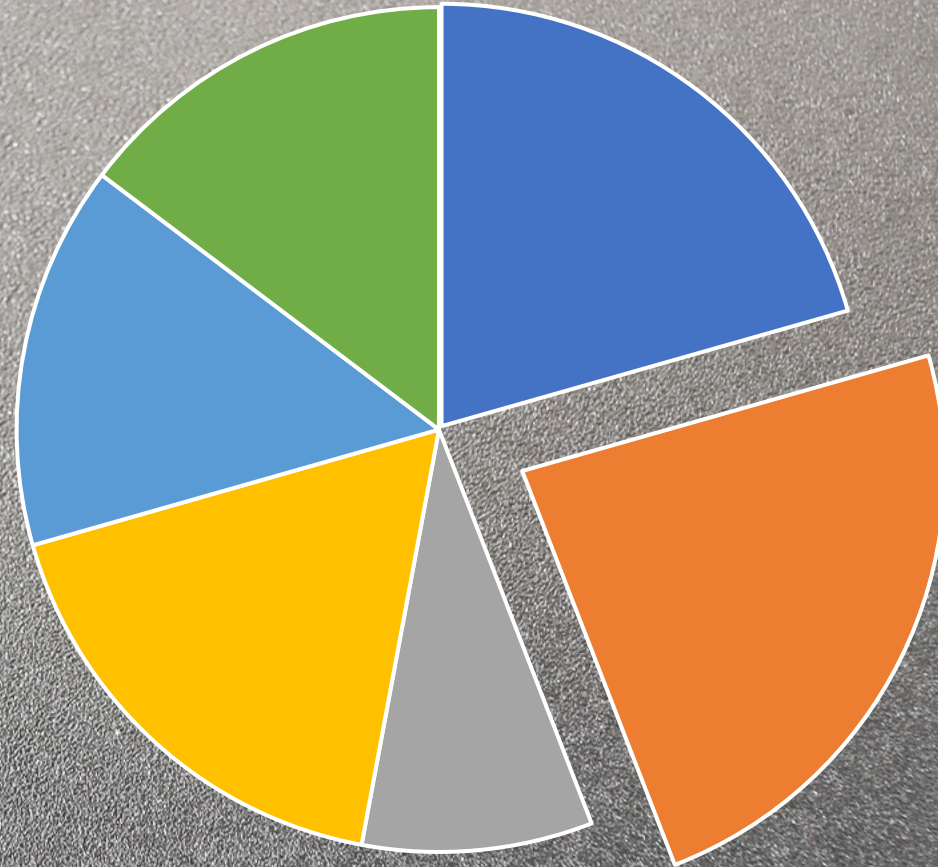

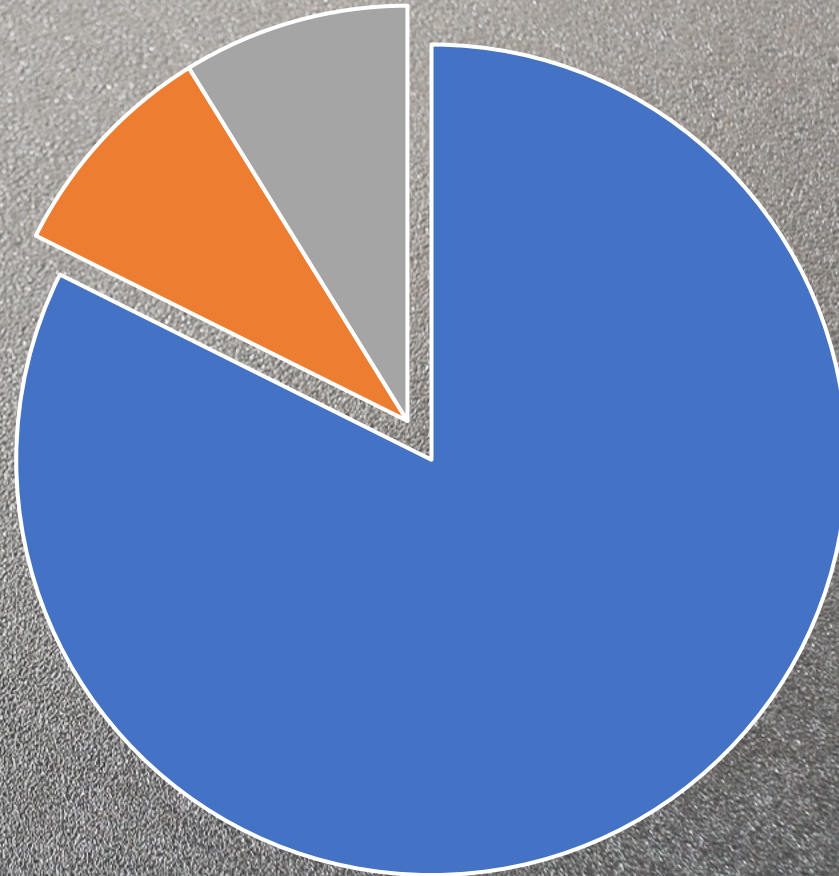

EVMS and ODU Parking Integration

ODU Parking

- Open facilities with active parking enforcement
- One institution
- Parking paid by individuals
- Active parking account management
- Campus transportation system

EVMC Parking

- Gated facilities with limited parking enforcement
- Multi-institution campus (EVMS, Sentara, CHKD)
- Parking paid by institutions and visitors, some validations
- Passive parking account management
- Campus transportation system
