The Hampton Roads Youth Wind Ensemble, (affectionately called "H-R-Y-wee" by its members) has been in existence since 1999. Housed on the campus of Old Dominion University and sponsored by its Community Music Division, HRYWE is essentially a community band for young people in grades 8 through 12, who are truly serious about making music. Countless band students have grown up through the program up until their high school graduation. Some have gone on to major in music. Many keep music-making an important part of their adult life.
