CSPI was started in 1971 by three scientists who saw the need for an organization to evaluate the effects of science and technology on society and to promote national policies responsive to consumers' interests. CSPI focuses primarily on health and nutrition issues, disclosing deceptive marketing practices, dangerous food additives or contaminants, and flawed science propagated by profits. Findings are communicated in press interviews and a variety of educational materials, which include reports, books, posters, software, videos, and the Center's [Nutrition Action Healthletter](#). CSPI also has a vigorous program focused on reducing the harm caused by alcoholic beverages. Generally, an internship is for ten weeks. Undergraduate interns are paid an hourly wage of \$6.00/hour (\$7.00/hour for graduate students). The specific dates of an internship are flexible and depend on our needs and the applicant's schedule.
