Expanded Statement of Institutional Purpose

Institutional Mission Reference

The Master of Engineering (M.E.) offers graduate students a high quality degree program in Engineering that meets the national standard of excellence. Program faculty are committed to quality teaching and the discovery of new knowledge. Institutional Goal(s) Supported

Intended Educational (Student) Outcomes, Methods for Assessment, Criteria for Success, Assessment Results, and Use of Results

Intended Outcome 1

Graduates have sufficient advanced knowledge in their chosen field.

Method for Assessing Outcome 1 and Criterion for Success: At least 80% of graduates demonstrate a sufficient depth of knowledge and an ability to synthesize concepts during the oral defense of their project or comprehensive examination before their Master's Committee. Committee members will rate graduation candidates on a high/medium/low pass scale and provide specific comments on students strengths and weaknesses. Only high and medium passes will be considered indications of success with respect to this outcome.

Intended Outcome 2

Graduates have improved their employability, promotability, and their prospects for career advancement.

Method for Assessing Outcome 2 and Criterion for Success: Two (or more) years after graduation, 80% of graduates say that their chances for employment, promotion, or career advancement were enhanced because of the program. Specific comments about the most and least beneficial aspects of the program will be sought.

Intended Outcome 3

Graduates are satisfied with their academic program and their experience at Old Dominion University.

Method for Assessing Outcome 3 and Criterion for Success: Two (or more) years after graduation, at least 80% of graduates say that they are satisfied with their program and that they would recommend the program to others. Specific comments about program strengths and weaknesses will be sought.

Alternate Method for Assessing Outcome 3 and Criterion for Success: At least 80% of graduation candidates say they are satisfied with their program and that they would recommend the program to others. Specific comments about program strengths and weaknesses will be sought.

Intended Outcome 4

Graduates who have conducted projects, have completed their projects successfully and presented the results in a professional forum.

Method for Assessing Outcome 4 and Criterion for Success: The projects of at least 60% of the graduates are judged favorably by their peers.

Intended Outcome 5

Employers are satisfied with the preparation and performance of program graduates.

Method for Assessing Outcome 5 and Criterion for Success: 80% of employers employing graduates of the program are satisfied with the preparation and qualifications of program graduates.
