



Dr. Johnny J. Moye

Career & Technology Education Administrator

Johnny J Moye enlisted in the United States Navy in 1975. He started his 27-year Naval career at Naval Recruit Training Command, Great Lakes, IL.

Master Chief Moye's duty stations include the USS Manitowoc (LST-1180), Shore Intermediate Maintenance Activity-Little Creek, and the USS Comte De Grasse (DD974). He earned his Surface Warfare device and was advanced to Chief Petty Officer in 1985 while serving aboard the USS Preserver (ARS-8). Moye then served at Naval Communications Station United Kingdom located at Thurso, Scotland. He was advanced to Senior Chief Petty Officer in 1990 while stationed at Commander, Oceanographic Systems Atlantic. Moye then served as Staff Communications Officer on two destroyer squadron staffs, the Commander, Destroyer Squadron Ten, and the Commander, Destroyer Squadron Thirty-Two, where he was advanced to Master Chief Petty Officer in 1995. Moye then served as Command Master Chief and Administrative Department Head at Naval Computer and Telecommunications Station, Detachment Rota, Spain. He then served as the Non-Commissioned Officer in Charge of the NATO Communications Facility, Norfolk, Virginia. Master Chief Moye retired from active duty service in January 2003.

Among other awards, Master Chief Moye received the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Navy Commendation Medal (with two gold stars), and Navy & Marine Corps Achievement Medal (with three gold stars). In three of his last five years of service, Master Chief Moye was selected as the base Athlete of the Year.

During the fall semester of 2003, Johnny became a high school technology education teacher at Hickory High School in Chesapeake, VA. In 2008, he was awarded the Virginia Technology Education Association "Technology Education High School Teacher of the Year" award. Also in 2008, Johnny received the Pitsco/Hearlihy FTE Grant Award from the International Technology Education Association (ITEA). In March 2009 the ITEA awarded him with the "Teacher Excellence" award as well as the "Donald Maley Outstanding Graduate Student Citation."

Participating in Old Dominion University's (ODU) Military Career Transition Program, Johnny received his MS in Education in 2003. He received support and guidance from the **Troops To Teachers** program during his first three years of teaching. In July 2009, Johnny received his Ph.D. in Education (Concentration in Occupational and Technical Studies) from ODU. Dr. Moye currently serves as Chesapeake Public Schools Supervisor of Career and Technical Education.

Dr. Moye is involved with the future of technology and engineering education. The National Assessment Governing Board/National Assessment of Educational Progress invited him to serve as a Steering Committee member in the development of the 2014 NAEP Technology and Engineering Literacy Assessment. This landmark assessment tool will be used to gauge United States students' technological and engineering literacy in the future.

In the spring of 2010, Dr. Moye was elected President of the Virginia Technology Education Association. Supporting the teaching profession, he has authored and published numerous articles in state, national, and international journals and magazines.

Dr. Moye is married to the former Debra Jean Riggan of Buffalo Junction, VA. They have four children, Brooke, April, Brandon, and Sarah Elizabeth.
