Center for Global Health

With increased globalization there is a dramatic increase in the worldwide interconnectedness such that health and well-being know no boundaries. Global health is local health; local health is global health. Interdisciplinary teams of experts who can assess and appreciate the problem from the holistic or whole perspective are essential to successfully deal with global issues such as rising sea level, health disparities, access to care, and the obesity and diabetes epidemic. Global health professionals are being asked to address increasingly complex, interconnected issues that encompass clinical, technologic, social, economic and political consid-

In response to the increasing complexity and progression of global health concerns, there has been a surge in the creation of Centers for Global Health. The Old Dominion University's Center for Global Health is unique in that we will be the first to base our Center's training, education and research on systems thinking; a holistic and interdisciplinary approach. This sets the ODU Center for Global Health apart from other university-based global health centers and promotes interdisciplinary collaborative initiatives. We will be known for innovation in online education and research based in systems thinking that will offer an added value to global health professionals engaged in developing sustainable solutions for some of society's most challenging issues for the 21st century.

The overriding goal of the ODU Center for Global Health is to actively support efforts of graduate students, faculty and staff to improve the health and well-being of the world's populations through interdisciplinary health research, education and practice.

The ODU Center for Global Health will sponsor events to announce the creation of the center including forums, conferences and expositions, starting with a President's series featuring a nationally and internationally recognized figure in global-health-related issues. The Center will offer a graduate certificate program in global health, provide services to our global partners and enhance local and global experiences for faculty and students to solve real-world problems at home and abroad.

School of Dental Hygiene Faculty Kicking the Lecture Habit: Evidence-based Interactive Approaches to Improve Learning

Most educators seek to design and integrate strategies that improve classroom structure, and foster student participation and critical thinking. Research validates that active learning engages the adult learner and enhances learning. Evolving technologies have created an avenue to make learning active and enable students to retain new skills. In contrast, traditional lecture-based formats produce noninteractive students and limit comprehension. Because of technology, 21st century students have distinctively different learning styles than those of previous generations. The "net" generation of students is surrounded by digital technology and educators can employ these technologies to enhance learning and

engagement in and beyond the classroom. Moreover, the use of technology can increase in-class and out-of-class participation, subject matter interest, and redefine the classroom.

In March 2013, assistant professors Meg Lemaster, Ann Bruhn and Tara Newcomb from the School of Dental Hygiene will help educators "kick the habit" of the traditional podium lecture-based course and apply learning strategies that incorporate technology when they lead a workshop at the Annual Session of the American Dental Education Association in Seattle, Washington. By example, these faculty will utilize a variety of methods to foster problem solving and critical thinking, e.g., social media, online delivery videos, audience response systems (clickers), interactive technology, computer-based classroom strategies, require participation and provide immediate visual and auditory feedback to the participants. Lemaster, Bruhn and Newcomb will demonstrate approaches to overcome common barriers to these strategies, and provide hands-on activities so that participants can include these experiences within their classes. While active learning benefits all learning styles, faculty needs guidance to implement technology correctly. Participants will bring personal wireless devices for maximum participation in interactive activities.

During its annual Legislative Rally Day, January 25, 2013, the leadership of the Virginia Dental Hygienists' Association and Joyce Downs Flores, Assistant Professor and Kelly Williams, Adjunct Assistant Professor, mentored dental hygiene students at the *General Assembly* in Richmond. Students were able to practice their roles as advocates for the oral health of the public by talking with lobbyists, legislators, and aides about bills important to health, welfare and education. Students received a formal welcome in the House of Delegates and Senate chambers where they observed debates on bills and other business. Concepts and processes learned in class were applied to influence the legislative process, health policy and Commonwealth spending. Experience in the legislative process prepares students to assume professional leadership roles once they graduate. The students were able to interact with dental hygiene faculty and students from other Virginia schools and tour the Capitol.





• February is National Children's Dental Health Month. This month-long national observance brings together dedicated dental professionals, health care providers and others to promote oral health to children, and their parents, caregivers, and teachers. Developing effective oral care behaviors at an early age and scheduling regular dental visits help children achieve a lifetime of health.

Give Kids A Smile is an annual centerpiece to National Children's Dental Health Month. Give Kids A Smile was designed to provide education, preventive and or restorative care to low-income children who do not have access to dental care. In support of this initiative, on February 11, 2013, Old Dominion University School of Dental Hygiene and the Tidewater

Dental Association partnered to provide preventive dental services to locally underserved children at the on campus Old Dominion University Sofia and David Konnikoff Dental Hygiene Care Facility. About 80 dentally-underserved children from the Boys and Girls Clubs of Tidewater and Lambert's Community Center received oral health education, examinations, fluoride varnish therapy, dental x-rays, and pit and fissure sealants as needed. Lynn Tolle, Professor of Dental Hygiene who coordinated the event for the 14th consecutive year commented that "volunteer area dentists and ODU dental hygiene students and faculty collaborated to improve the oral health of disadvantaged children in our community. Over \$8,000. in free professional care was provided."



U.S. News & World Report Recognizes ODU Online Programs

Accolades for Old Dominion's online degree programs continue to roll in - this time with recognition from U.S. News & World Report. The vaunted magazine listed ODU's online graduate nursing program as the 28th best in the nation in its 2013 rankings of higher education institutions.
