cāsus dātīvus

cāsus dātīvus

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*The father gives pears **to** his sons. (The father gives his sons pears.)*
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Notā bene: English can express the indirect object either with a preposition or with word order, as you can see in the alternate translations in parentheses.

reflexive pronoun *sē*

The third person accusative/ablative reflexive pronoun sē is used to reflect the action back on the subject of the sentence. That is the subject does something to herself or is the object of a preposition in the same clause. Consider the following sentences:

- ① Puella sē in speculō videt et sē interrogat: “Estne foedus nāsus meus?” [ll.8–10]
- ② Syra ōstium aperit. . . , neque ōstium post sē claudit. [ll.14–15]
- ③ Iūlia Syram post sē in speculō videt. [l.15]
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*Syra opens the door. . . , but does not close the door behind **herself**.*
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Syra opens the door. . . , but does not close the door behind herself.
- ③ Iūlia Syram post *sē* in speculō videt. [l.15]
Julia sees Syra behind herself in the mirror.
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Julia sees Syra behind herself in the mirror.
- ④ Syra nōn videt lacrimās Iūliae, nam puella *sē* nōn vertit. [l.16]
Syra does not see Julia’s tears, for the girl does not turn (herself) around.
