- How long would the voyage take?
- What would you have to take with you?
- What kinds of experiences and dangers might you encounter along the way?
- How might someone in Rome find out if you made it safely to your destination?
- What would you do at the end of your voyage?
- Et cētera...

Be creative, but authentic! Consult a map! A good paper will draw comparisons and contrasts between modern and ancient means of travel.
