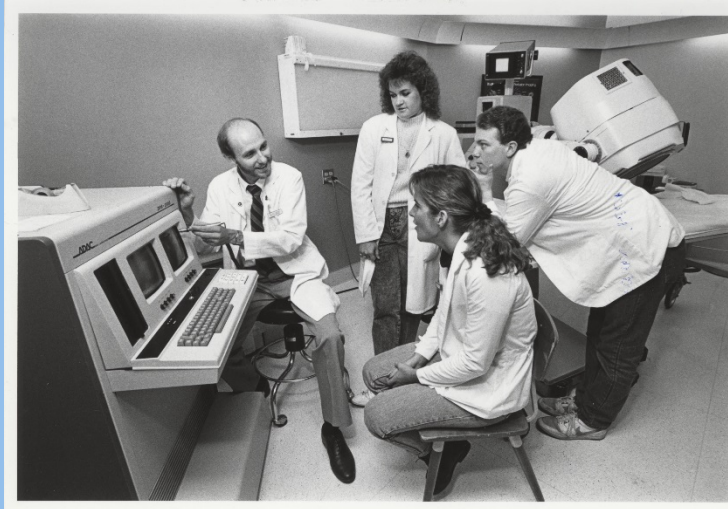

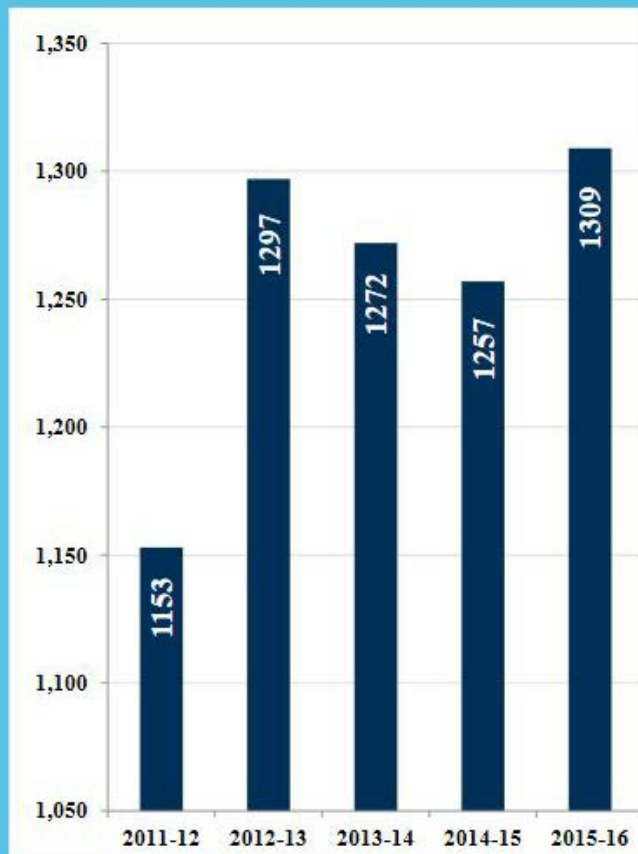

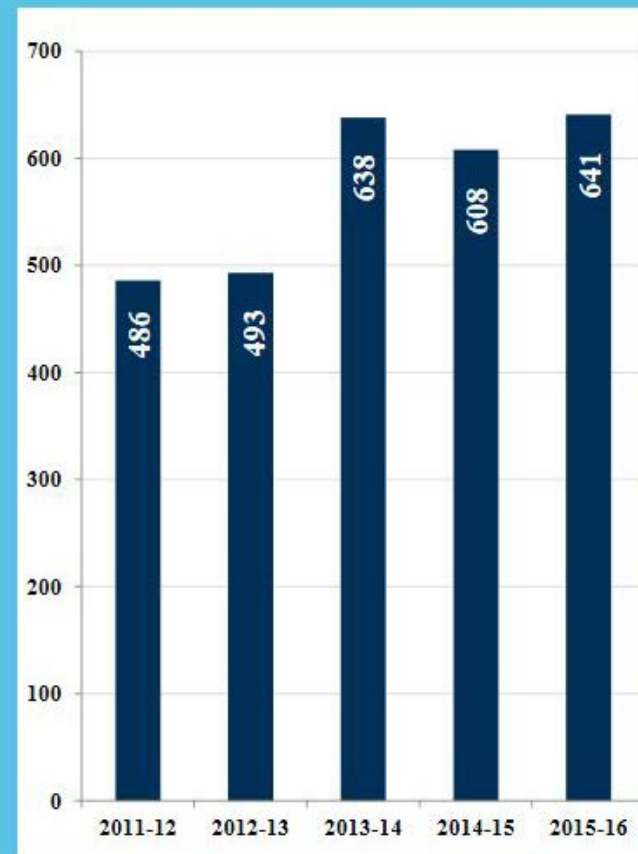


# Overall Enrollment & Degrees

Total Headcounts\*



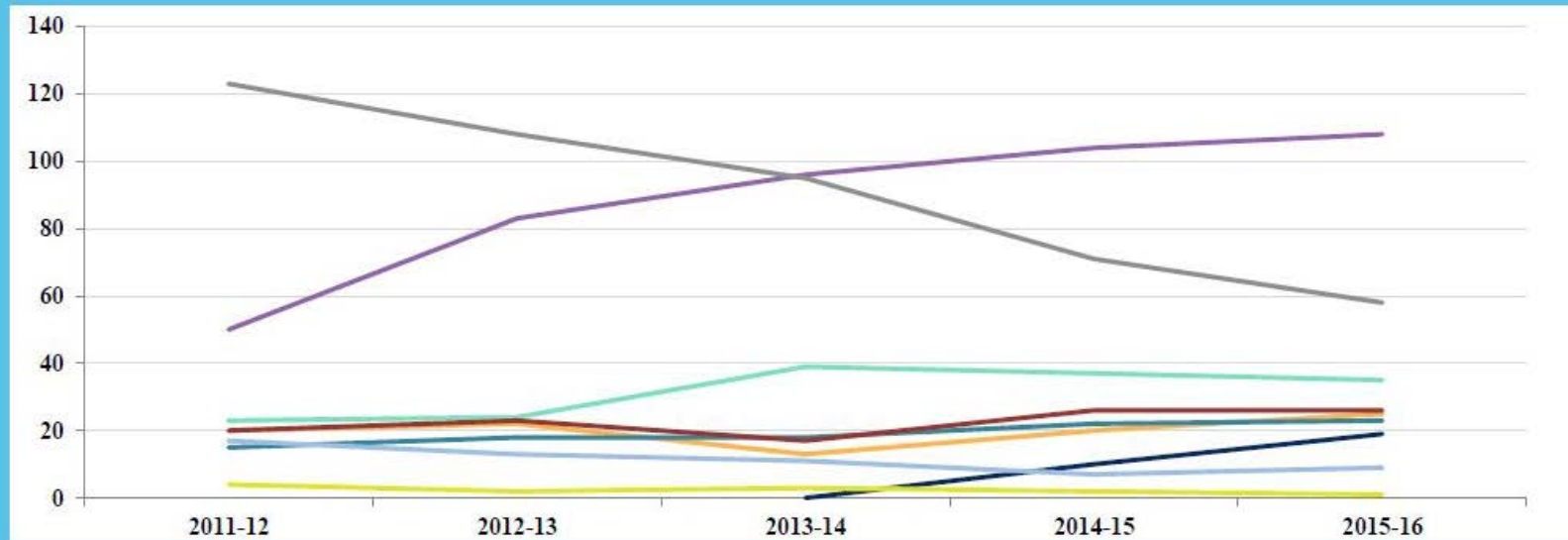
Degrees Awarded\*

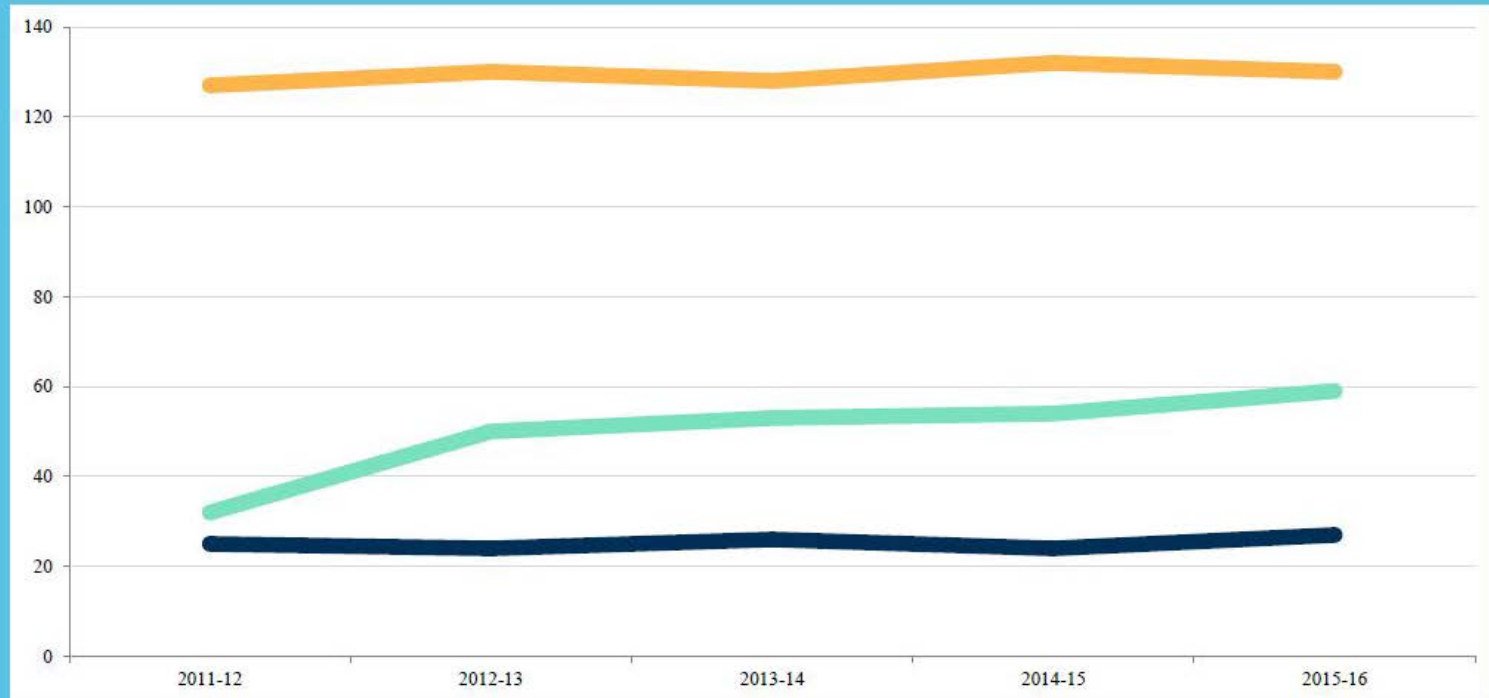
