Note: Students qualify for entry into MATH 117 and MATH 217 via placement test score or by completing MATH 101 with a B or higher or by having transferred in MATH DE or other math college credit.
Note: Completion of the AS in Business Administration is required for this articulation agreement. Students who do not complete the AS-Business Administration at Richard Bland College will need to successfully complete all lower-level general education courses required of ODU graduates.
Requirements for graduation include completion of at least 120 credit hours with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 overall and in the major. Students must also have a minimum of $25 \%$ of the required credit hours completed at Old Dominion University, at least 12 of which are upper-level major courses. They are required to complete ENGL 110C and ENGL 211C, 221C or 231C, and the writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of C or better. Finally, students are required to complete the Senior Assessment prior to graduation.
