NOTE: Majors must have a minimum 2.8 GPA (overall, within major coursework, and within professional education coursework), a grade of C or better in all courses, and meet the Praxis I requirement to be admitted to the undergraduate teacher education program. All students should apply for and be admitted into the undergraduate teacher education program at the completion of the first semester at ODU. Delaying admission to the undergraduate teacher education program will adversely affect the ability to complete this program in 4 years. Please refer to the catalog and consult your advisor for additional requirements, prerequisites, and eligibility for teacher licensure in Virginia.

**If credit is received for ARTH 121A, majors must take MUSC 308 or 460. If credit is received for MUSC 264A, majors must take ARTS 305.

Requirements for graduation include a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.80 overall and in the major, a grade of C or better in all courses required for the major, including prerequisite courses, 120 credit hours, which must include both a minimum of 30 credit hours overall and 12 credit hours in upper-level courses in the major program from Old Dominion University, completion of ENGL 110C, ENGL 211C or 221C or 231C, and a writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of C or better, and completion of Senior Assessment.
