Delaying admission to the undergraduate teacher education program will adversely affect the ability to complete this program in 4 years. Meeting Praxis req. before finishing SPED 400 is strongly recommended.

***If credit is received for ARTH 121A, majors must take MUSC 308 or 460. If credit is received for MUSC 264A, majors must take ARTS 305.*

Requirements for graduation include a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.80 overall and in the major, a grade of C or better in all courses required for the major, including prerequisite courses, 120 credit hours, which must include both a minimum of 30 credit hours overall and 12 credit hours in upper-level courses in the major program from Old Dominion University, completion of ENGL 110C, ENGL 211C or 221C or 231C, and a writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of C or better, and completion of Senior Assessment.
