*PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS: Program Requirements for the pre-licensure nursing program include CHEM 105N/106N, BIOL 250 & 251, BIOL 103, PSYC 203S, STAT 130M, ENGL 110C, and SOC 201S. A grade of C or better is required in departmental required courses; C- is not acceptable. A minimum of 30 credit hours toward the nursing program requirements must be completed prior to applying; program requirements and general education requirements may be in progress at time of application but must be completed before the nursing program begins in the fall.

The School of Nursing requires completion of the TOEFL exam for English proficiency for students who have a first language other than English. A minimum score of 550(paper) or 79(internet-based) is required for admission.

NOTE: Oral Communication and Information Literacy and Research are met through the major. Option D satisfies the Upper Division General Education requirement by completing six (6) credits at the 300-400 level outside of the college of your major. Foreign language may be satisfied with 3 years of 1 or 2 years of 2 languages in high school; graduation from HS prior to 12/31/85, or with AA or AS Degree from VCCS.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: Requirements for graduation include a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 overall and in the major, a grade of C or better in all courses required for the major, including prerequisite courses, 120 credit hours, which must include both a minimum of 30 credit hours overall and 12 credit hours in upper-level courses in the major program from Old Dominion University, completion of ENGL 110C, ENGL 211C or 221C or 231C, and a writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of C or better, and completion of Senior Assessment.
