GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: Requirements for graduation include a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 overall and in the major, a minimum of 120 credit hours, which must include both a minimum of 30 credit hours overall and 12 credit hours in upper-level courses in the major program for Old Dominion University, completion of ENGL 110C and ENGL 211C, 221C or 231C, and the writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of C or better, and completion of Senior Assessment.

^{**}Students may need MATH prerequisite before taking STAT 130M depending on SAT/ACT score or previous math credit. Score of 460 or higher on Math SAT or 24 or higher on Math ACT or credit for MATH 101M or 102M or 103M with grade of C or better required for placement into STAT 130M.

^{***}PROGRAM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS for Health Services Administration: Students who do not have a current license as a health professional, an Associate of Applied Science degree, or a certification must complete CHP 200, 328, 335 and 390 before applying to program. Admission into ODU does not guarantee admission into the B.S.H.S. program. Eligibility must be documented with a separate admission form to the B.S.H.S. program director.

^{****}For the Concentration in Health Services Administration students must complete the following coursework: MGMT 325 and MGMT 340, 350, 360, 417, 418, 451, 452 or 462.
