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Up to 23 professional elective credits will be awarded upon program admission. Students may need additional elective credits to complete 120 minimum required for graduation

**\*PROGRAM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS:** Must be completed with a C or better; C- is not acceptable. Application deadlines are February 15th, May 15th and October 15th. CHP 200 and STAT 130M must be completed with grade of C or better before submitting program application. Students must be admitted to the program before enrolling in any 300/400 level CHP major courses. Lower division general education requirements must be complete before enrolling in 300/400 level CHP major courses. Admission into ODU does not guarantee admission into the B.S.H.S. program. Eligibility must be documented with a separate admission form to the B.S.H.S. program director. Students must have current licensure as a health professional, an Associate of Applied Science degree, and/or certification to be eligible for the BSHS Health Services Administration program.

**Professional Electives:** Current licensure as a health professional, an Associate of Applied Science degree, and/or certification will be used toward satisfying the professional elective requirements. Up to 23 professional elective credits will be awarded. Certification refers to the passing of an exam upon completion of an educational program to demonstrate competency in a chosen profession. Programs that have been accepted include: Medical Corps, Radiation Technology, Nursing, Occupational Therapy Assistant, Dental Hygiene, Emergency Medical Technology, Respiratory Therapy, Physical Therapy Assistant, or military experience such as Hospital Corpsman. **\*\* MANAGEMENT MINOR:** Select four MGMT 300/400-level electives from the following: MGMT 330 (MGMT 325 pre or co-requisite), MGMT 340 (MGMT 325 prereq; MGMT 330 pre or co-requisite), MGMT 350, MGMT 360 (MGMT 340 prereq), MGMT 417 (MGMT 325 prereq), MGMT 418 (MGMT 325 and 340 prereq), MGMT 452 (MGMT 325 prereq) or MGMT 462 (MGMT 325 prereq).

**NOTE:** Elective credits may be needed to achieve 120 credit hours required for the degree. Suggested minors/certificates: Environmental Health, Occupational Safety, Environmental Issues and Management, Health and Wellness, Diversity Certificate, Entrepreneurial Certificate. Suggested electives: ENVH 401, ENVH 420, HLSC 405. Philosophy and Impact of Technology requirements are met in the major. Upper Division General Education is met by Management Minor. Foreign language may be satisfied with 3 years of 1 or 2 years of 2 languages in high school; graduation from HS prior to 12/31/85, or with AA or AS Degree from VCCS.

**GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:** Requirements for graduation include a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 overall and in the major, a minimum of 120 credit hours, which must include both a minimum of 30 credit hours overall and 12 credit hours in upper-level courses in the major program for Old Dominion University, completion of ENGL 110C and ENGL 211C, 221C or 231C, and the writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of C or better, and completion of Senior Assessment.
