All students should apply for and be admitted into the undergraduate teacher education program by their 60th credit hour. Delaying admission to the undergraduate teacher education program will adversely affect your ability to complete this program in 4 years. **Earning 150 on Praxis Core Math subtest (5732) paired w/ 470 composite score on VCLA (VC099) is the recommended method to meet this req.

Majors must apply, be admitted, and complete the 5th year graduate program before being eligible for licensure. Graduate students must maintain a 3.0 GPA and have all coursework completed with at least a B- grade
