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## MATH/SCIENCE PLACEMENT INFORMATION:

STAT 130M requires Math SAT of 460 (OLD)/500 (NEW) or better or ACT of 24 or better or credit for MATH 102 M or 103 M ;
MATH 162M requires a Math SAT of 560/580 or better or ACT of 30 or better or credit for MATH 102M or 103M
BIOL 121 N requires placement into ENGL 110C (score of 3 on WSPT) or credit for ENGL 110C and score of 460(OLD)/500(NEW) or higher on MATH SAT or score of 24 or higher on MATH ACT or credit for MATH 102M or 103M.
CHEM 121 N requires credit for Math 102 M or 103 M with a grade of C or better OR placement into MATH 162 M and one of the following: CHEM 103 N with a grade of P (Pass/Fail), CHEM 105N with a grade of C or better, Score of 3 or better on the Chemistry Placement Exam, Score of $80 \%$ or better on the Chemistry Review Modules Final Exam
PHYS 111 N requires credit for MATH 102M or 103M with grade of C or better
*PROGRAM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS: Must be completed with a C or better; C- is not acceptable. Application deadlines are February 15th, May 15 th and October 15 th. CHP 200, ENGL 110C, BIOL $121 \mathrm{~N} / 122 \mathrm{~N}$ and $123 \mathrm{~N} / 124 \mathrm{~N}$, MATH 162 M and STAT 130 M must be completed with grade of C or better before submitting program application. Students must be admitted to the program before enrolling in any $300 / 400$ level CHP major courses. Lower division general education requirements must be complete before enrolling in 300/400 level CHP major courses.

NOTE: Oral Communication, Philosophy and Impact of Technology are met in the major. Option D satisfies the Upper Division General Education requirement by completing six (6) credits at the $300-400$ level outside of the college of your major. Foreign language may be satisfied with 3 years of 1 or 2 years of 2 languages in high school; graduation from HS prior to $12 / 31 / 85$, or with AA or AS Degree from VCCS.
Elective credits may be needed to achieve the minimum 120 credit hours required for the degree. Electives can be from any college. Some electives that can be considered are CHP 425, 465, ENVH 401, 420, and HLSC 405.
GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: Requirements for graduation include a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 overall and in the major, a minimum of 120 credit hours, which must include both a minimum of 30 credit hours overall and 12 credit hours in upper-level courses in the major program for Old Dominion University, completion of ENGL 110C and ENGL 211C, 221C or 231C, and the writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of C or better, and completion of Senior Assessment.
