

Additional Graduate Degrees and Concentrations Policy

Graduate students may pursue two graduate degrees concurrently at Old Dominion University, provided that they have been admitted to both degree programs. In certain cases, students may request that graduate-level course work used to fulfill requirements for the one graduate degree be applied to the other. However, the student must still complete the standard minimum number of unique credits for each degree (i.e., 30 for a master's degree; 30 for an education specialist degree; 48 for a post-master's doctoral degree; or 78 for a post-bachelor's doctoral degree). Prior approval of both graduate program directors and appropriate college deans is required.

Graduate students may also pursue more than one concentration within a single degree as long as the requirements for each concentration are met. Courses may sometimes satisfy requirements in more than one concentration when these requirements overlap. Students interested in pursuing multiple concentrations should design a plan of study with the graduate program director and/or concentration coordinator. Prior approval of the degree's graduate program director and college dean is required.

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
