Dear Governor Youngkin, Chairwoman Lucas, and Chairman Davis:

This report is being submitted in compliance with § 23.1-401.1 (D) of the Code of Virginia. This letter/report details Old Dominion University's implementation of § 23.1-401.1 entitled "Constitutionally protected speech; policies, materials, and reports; report." This report is also included on the *Student Freedom of Speech and Activism* website at <u>https://www.odu.edu/life/dean-students/free-speech</u>.

During this reporting cycle, we have reviewed policies to be updated based on the University policy review schedule. This year, we continued to promote our freedom of expression resource website to inform our student body. Students were also provided information and resources regarding freedom of speech as we continue to promote the use of our freedom of expression website. We have begun providing follow-up education to our student leaders so that we may engage them in educating their peers, while also addressing their questions, ideas

and/or concerns about this topic. We continue to provide platforms for students to express their views on topics involving politics and social justice.

Specifically, the following measures have been taken during the most recent reporting period ending December 1, 2022, to adhere to the above-referenced law:

- Updated the website *(Student Freedom of Speech and Activism*), which describes freedom of speech, refers to related policies and describes the means to report incidents, where freedom of speech has been disrupted. It now provides education on related topics, as well as resource information.
- The <u>University's Demonstration Policy 1700</u> promotes rights and resources for students to exercise Freedom of Speech. University Policy 1700 was reviewed and received final approval from the Board of Visitors as a permanent policy on August 8, 2022.
- Provided all students (including first-year students as follow-up to their onboarding/orientation) with the video (along with a link to the freedom of expression resource website) that explains freedom of expression.
