- 1. ENGL 110C and 211C (ENG 111 and 112 or 115) are required for the BS in OTS, Training Specialist at ODU. If AAS only requires ENG 111, student will have to take ENGL 211C at ODU.
- 2. Please consult with your VCCS advisor to select the required course (s) for the AAS, but that will also fulfill ODU's required Lower-Division General Education course(s). Choose courses from ODU's VCCS Transfer Guide http://www.odu.edu/transfer/vccs-transfer-quide.html in any of the following categories: Philosophy and Ethics, Interpreting the Past, Human Creativity, Literature, or Foreign Language.
- 3. MATH 101M (MTH 154) or higher is required for the BS degree at ODU. However, if a student transfers without MATH 101M or higher they can take it at ODU.
- 4. If possible, take PSY 200 or 201, ECO 120 or 150, ITE 119 or 152, and ACC 211 to fulfill major requirements for the BS degree. Students can take these courses at ODU if they are not included in the AAS curriculum.
- 5. Take all courses required to complete the AAS degree at VCCS. Some courses will be used as training electives for the BS degree at ODU.
- 6. Students may have to complete additional General Education courses at ODU, to meet the required guidelines for the Lower-Division General Education (LDGE) waiver: https://www.odu.edu/sites/default/files/documents/guidelines-vccs-associate-meet-lowdiv-gened-req.pdf
- 7. Consult with ODU advisor for the remaining required courses to complete the BS in OTS Training Specialist at ODU. Prior work or military experience can be used for credit. For more information, please consult with ODU advisor and visit: https://www.odu.edu/prior-learning-assessment
