- 1. ENGL 110C and 211C (ENG 111 and 112) are required for the BS in Human Services at ODU. If the AAS only requires ENG 111, student will have to take ENGL 211C at ODU.
- 2. SOC 201S is required for the BS in Human Services at ODU. If student does not take SOC 200 at the VCCS, they will have to take SOC 201S at ODU.
- 3. Please consult with your VCCS advisor to select the required course (s) for the AAS, but that will also fulfill ODU's required Lower-Division General Education course(s). Choose courses from ODU's VCCS Transfer Guide http://www.odu.edu/transfer/vccs-transfer-quide.html in the categories: Philosophy and Ethics, Interpreting the Past (History), Human Creativity, Literature, or Foreign Language, depending on the AAS requirements.
- 4. Take all courses required to complete the AAS degree at VCCS.
- 5. Students may have to complete additional General Education courses at ODU, to meet the required guidelines for the Lower-Division General Education (LDGE) waiver: https://www.odu.edu/sites/default/files/documents/quidelines-vccs-associate-meet-lowdiv-gened-reg.pdf
- 6. HMS 121 and 250 can be substituted for HMSV 343; and HMS 141 and 258 can be substituted for HMSV 447 or 448 (with the exception of those wishing to take a substance abuse track, in which all courses for the track are required). Student may receive hours that could be applied to the final internship at ODU with HMS 290 credit from VCCS.

- > Lower-Division General Education waiver and course substitutions are not automatic upon enrollment to ODU, students must notify academic advisor for these to be processed upon verification.
- Course requirements listed in this agreement are based on the 2024-2025 catalogs for each institution but are valid until 2027, unless an updated agreement quide was created and is available on the ODU Transfer Pathways website: https://odu.edu/transfer/transfer-pathways/vccs
