Joint Appointments

Joint appointments are used for individuals whose expertise cuts across academic departments or, programs. Such appointments must assist Old Dominion University in providing strong interdisciplinary offerings and in building emerging fields that cross the borders of the traditional disciplines. A joint appointment must reflect the teaching and research expertise of the faculty member.

A joint position is shared by two or more academic units, but the position must be based in a home department. The "primary appointment" is in the home department, and the "secondary appointment" is where the joint appointment is extended to this position. The department of primary appointment is responsible for all rank, promotion, and tenure actions with appropriate input from the department of the secondary appointment. The Dean(s) determine(s) where the joint appointment will be primarily based

Joint faculty appointments are initiated by a head of the involved unit (department Chair or Program Director) or a Dean in agreement with the faculty member seeking, the joint appointment and in consultation with the faculty of the departments involved in the joint appointment.

Deans must secure the endorsement of the appropriate Executive Vice President before making any commitments regarding a joint appointment. The endorsement of the Vice President for Research will be required if the partnership involved a research center. The Chair of the primary department is responsible for documenting the terms and conditions of the joint appointment in a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) signed by the faculty member, the involved department Chairs (or the Director of a program that is not administered by a department), their Dean(s), and the appropriate Executive Vice President. MOAs should address the following, as appropriate: distribution of service obligations, financial arrangements, teaching assignments, voting rights, and performance evaluations. Records for joint appointments will be maintained by Academic Affairs.

This policy does not preclude the establishment of joint appointments with institutions outside the University.
