

# American Psychological Association (APA) Accreditation Status

The PhD in Clinical Psychology is a doctoral concentration in the ODU Department of Psychology. A founding member of the APA accredited Virginia Consortium Program in Clinical Psychology, ODU has led the administration of the Consortium and trained doctoral students in clinical psychology for over 43 years. ODU's Clinical PhD Program is applying for APA accreditation as a clinical psychology program independent of the Consortium. The Program applied in Summer 2025 with a site visit anticipated in Fall 2026. Although the timeline and application outcome are not assured, we hope to receive APA Accreditation on Contingency in Spring 2027. If a student completes a program that is accredited on Contingency prior to graduation, that student is deemed to have completed an APA accredited program.

On the basis of demonstrated proficiency, a student may be granted a reduction in (i.e., waiver) required courses. Proficiency must be established to the satisfaction of the course instructor and Directors. A student may request to waive no more than six semester hours of eligible courses based on graduate courses completed elsewhere prior to admission to the Program. Practicum, required clinical courses, dissertation, and internship cannot be waived. The total number of required hours for degree completion is not affected.
