\*PROGRAM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS: Students must complete the following courses with grades of C or higher to declare a major in Pre-Clinical Studies: HLTH 120G, ENGL 110C, BIOL 250, CHEM 121N &122N, CHEM 123N & 124N, MATH 102M or 103M or 162M and STAT 130M. A cumulative GPA of 2.7 or higher is also required.

NOTE: Option D satisfies the Upper Division General Education requirement by completing six (6) credits at the 300-400 level EXCEPT CSD, CYTO, CHP, DNTH, EXSC, ENVH, MLS, NMED, RT, PUBH.; Impact of Technology met in the major with HLSC 485. Foreign language may be satisfied with 3 years of 1 or 2 years of 2 languages in high school; graduation from HS prior to 12/31/85, or with AA or AS Degree from VCCS.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: Requirements for graduation include a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 overall and in the major, a minimum of 120 credit hours, which must include both a minimum of 30 credit hours overall and 12 credit hours in upperlevel courses in the major program for Old Dominion University, completion of ENGL 110C and ENGL 211C or 231C, and the writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of C or better, and completion of Senior Assessment.
