What's possible in general education?

One of the many things the Reform Committee has been discussing is the role of **Experiential Learning** in general education. Experiential Learning is active/hands-on learning plus meaningful reflection on the process. It can include activities like undergraduate research, study abroad, internships and work-based learning, and civic and community engagement. Students who engage in Experiential Learning often receive better grades, learn the subject at a deeper level,

and report feeling more confident in their abilities. More than 70% of ODU students already engage in some kind of active learning experience that could be considered Experiential Learning with the incorporation of guided reflection.

Looking Ahead...

This month, we are gathering input on the Learning Goals and Models via surveys, focus groups, and visits to departments, offices, and organizations. **Look for an invitation to a Town Hall later this semester.** Based on campus feedback, we will advance one or two models to the Faculty Senate for review in the spring. We have also launched a search for our first Director of General Education. Applications are due to search committee chair Josh Wallach by October 1. The position begins in January 2026.
