She is a former federal prosecutor who spent nearly a decade at the US Attorney's Office for the Southern District of New York (SDNY), most recently as chief of the Public Corruption Unit, where she oversaw some of the most high-profile, complex matters for the Department of Justice (DOJ). Rebekah defends companies and individuals before government agencies and in high-stakes litigation, and leads internal investigations involving significant regulatory, financial or reputational risk.

Rebekah represents companies, boards, executives and public institutions in matters involving financial fraud, corruption, accounting issues, export controls, bid-rigging and other enforcement actions led by the DOJ and Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). Clients turn to Rebekah for her strategic judgment, deep investigative experience and ability to navigate intense regulatory scrutiny. Chambers USA recognizes her as a leading lawyer in white-collar defense and government investigations.

A seasoned trial lawyer, Rebekah has tried numerous federal jury trials, supervised many more and argued extensively before the US Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit.

During her tenure at SDNY, Rebekah supervised a team of senior prosecutors in hundreds of white-collar and public corruption cases, including the high-profile prosecutions of US Sen. Robert Menendez; Sam Bankman-Fried; Ghislaine Maxwell; Michael Avenatti; Lev Parnas; and other prominent public officials. Earlier, as a prosecutor in the Terrorism and International Narcotics Unit, she handled major national security matters and twice received the Drug Enforcement Administration's Director's Award.

Before becoming a prosecutor, Rebekah clerked for Judge Katherine Polk Failla of the US District Court for the Southern District of New York.

- Representing a publicly traded technology company in a fraud and antitrust investigation by the DOJ, and in a parallel internal investigation related to the bidding and procurement process for federal government contracts

Mike’s recent litigation experience:

- **EarnIn consumer class actions (N.D. Cal.)** – Serves as lead counsel defending leading fintech company EarnIn in a series of class actions under various California consumer protection statutes; the cases present industry-defining questions about the validity of so-called earned wage access products
- **Pearson v. Chegg (D.N.J.)** – Served as lead counsel for Chegg in a complex copyright infringement matter brought by the leading US textbook publisher, directing a large team of lawyers through many court hearings, dozens of depositions and extensive expert discovery heading toward ultimate case disposition

- ***Anoush v. Uber***, along with six companion cases, **(D. Mass.)** – Served as co-lead trial counsel for Uber in a case brought by 34 taxi medallion-owning corporations that alleged unfair competition and conspiracy and sought more than \$400 million in damages at trial; won a complete defense verdict for Uber across the board, on both liability and damages (verdict upheld on appeal), and en route to the trial victory, managed three years of complex discovery and intensive motion practice in the case, along with six other consolidated cases brought by a total of 750+ taxi companies seeking more than \$1 billion in damages
- ***Phoenix Navigation Components LLC v. EMCORE (AAA arbitration in New York City and companion court cases in California and New York)*** – Won a significant plaintiff’s verdict and attorneys’ fee award for a cutting-edge navigation company after trial as first chair in a hotly contested breach of contract and trade secret case
- ***Theissen et al. v. Chegg (Superior Court of Santa Clara County, California, and related AAA action)*** – Served as lead counsel for Chegg in a successful resolution and dismissal of 16,000+ individual arbitrations filed following a massive data breach
- ***EMC v. Williams, EMC v. Alexis, EMC v. Baker and EMC v. Ferreira (D. Mass.)*** – Successfully defended employees of California-based data storage innovator Rubrik in four separate cases alleging theft of Dell EMC trade secrets and violations of nonsolicitation agreements; each action requested injunctive relief, no court orders ever issued and each of the cases was ultimately dismissed
- ***Paterno v. NCAA and Ray (Pennsylvania Court of Common Pleas)*** – Successfully represented the chair of the NCAA executive committee in a long-running case brought by the Joe Paterno family in the shadow of the Penn State/Jerry Sandusky scandal; after nearly four years of active litigation, and on the eve of summary judgment, the plaintiffs dismissed the case with zero consideration
- ***EMC v. Pure Storage (D. Mass.)*** – Successfully defended data storage company Pure Storage in seven highly publicized trade secret cases brought by EMC challenging the hiring of more than 200 EMC employees and allegations of unfair competition and disclosure of trade secrets

- Retained by a special board committee of a technology company to investigate whistleblower claims of illegal market conduct
- Retained by a top US university to advise on crisis management and conduct an internal investigation into alleged misconduct by a senior executive as reported in major national news stories
