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Message from the Global Emergency Medicine Fellowship Director: A. Shirley Jones, DO

I am thrilled to be the new Global EM Fellowship Director! My goal is to not only bring global health opportunities to fellows, but also to the entire EVMS/ODU EM Residency Program. I am excited for the EVMS residents, fellows, and faculty to experience the career fulfillment and gratification that accompanies lessening global healthcare inequalities in some of our world's most vulnerable populations. The program's focus will be on sustainable and longitudinal education projects, where we partner with and teach physicians in developing countries who do not have formal EM training. We can improve patient care and overall outcomes through education. This concept is explained by the wellknown quote, "if you give a man a fish, you feed him for a day. If you teach a man to fish, you feed him for a lifetime". I completed a Global Health Fellowship at the University of Utah in 2023. I have worked on projects to promote healthcare and develop healthcare systems both locally and abroad. Most of my global health work so far has been educating physicians working in two of the main emergency departments in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, as they do not have EM residency training. I have also worked locally with the Native American community, particularly the Navajo tribe, who are vastly underserved, impoverished, and have dramatic health disparities compared to other Americans. I have also worked on the border of India and Tibet, providing medical care to extremely remote villages in the Himalaya Mountains. I had the privilege of learning from some of our world leaders on international public health and have made numerous global EM connections through an opportunity on humanitarian emergencies sponsored by the WHO and ICRC in Geneva. So far I've visited over 40 countries in Africa, Asia, Europe, and the Americas and have friends on every continent minus Antarctica. In September of this year, a group of us including two of our PGY-2 residents, the former GEM Fellowship Program Director Dr. Carol McCammon, and EPT PA Sandy Springer will be teaching in Trinidad.
