

Researcher Spotlight—Sean Hesselbacher, MD

You have spent much of your academic career involved in research. What is your motivation for continuing this pursuit of research & scholarly work? I started research as an undergraduate with animal models of learning and memory, though I don't think I understood most of what we were doing at the time. Between college graduation and medical school (at EVMS!), I worked as a lab tech in an invasive cardiovascular research lab, where I gained a lot of exposure to experimental techniques. This helped me out when I was in PCCM fellowship and I worked with an outstanding mentor who had translational projects involving everything from cell



cultures to longitudinal clinical observations. It was during this time that I participated in a research certificate program, which gave me knowledge and understanding to be able to take on the clinical research projects I have been involved with since then. Clinical research, especially retrospective studies, more practically fits into the schedules of a primarily clinical physician.

You are the editor for a recently established, open-access journal - the *Eastern Virginia Medical Journal*. What inspired you to embark upon this journey? This journal was initially conceived by EVMS GME as a place for trainees to publish the results of their scholarly activity. It grew from there to include GME faculty and staff. I enjoy editorial work and peer review because it gives me the opportunity to learn about the forefront of medical science and, at the same time, have an impact on how it is presented to the world.

What are your goals, as chief editor, for maintaining this publication? What types of submissions are you hoping to receive at this time? My first short-term goal is the successful publication of the first issue! Moving forward, I anticipate 2 issues per year, so we will need to work to maintain the quality. I would also like to ultimately develop an educational curriculum that may include a process for mentoring trainees while they participate in the peer review process as well as a didactic curriculum and presentations. Ultimately, we will work toward indexing in PubMed Central. We intend to publish many types of articles, including Original Research or Brief Reports, Quality Improvement, Advances in Medical Education, Review Articles, Case Reports, Letters to the Editor, and Special Articles Since we are new, we can also be flexible in the types of articles we publish – if we find that our audience is especially interested in a particular type of article, we may be able to add it.

As a research mentor for trainees in various contexts (e.g., EVMS, Military/VA hospitals), what have you learned about the research process, in general, or about trainees' interests in research? Every trainee comes in with a different level of experience or comfort with research. I'm not so far out from where they are that I don't remember what it was like to try and figure things out, but I also have some experience to give them guidance. I think the most important things I can provide are keeping them on schedule. Since sleep medicine fellows have to stay on track to get a project done in a year, I help them navigate the particulars of government oversight. In general, I find that trainees have some wonderful ideas for research projects – another role I fill is to help them narrow their ideas down to something that can reasonably be accomplished in the time allotted.

What haven't we asked you about that you would like to share? We are always looking for high quality submissions to EVMJ, especially from Internal Medicine sources. We would like to make the publication process as painless as possible and a relatively "safe" place for trainees to learn to navigate the process. We aim to be a go-to submission site, for example, as a second choice (after the premier specialty journals) or when timely publication is needed. Submit case reports & manuscripts for EVMJ here.
