Additional Information for Political Science Majors

Be sure to complete and sign a Major Declaration Form at the Political Science Office. You must have completed 26 credits and ENGL 110C and ENGL 211C prior to declaring.

You will be assigned a faculty advisor upon submission of the Major Declaration Form. You must meet with your advisor at least once every semester prior to course registration.

Transfer students must complete at least 12 credits of upper level Political Science courses here at ODU.

INFORMATION LITERACY AND RESEARCH

Political Science majors can meet the information literacy and research general education requirement by taking POLS 308. In this way POLS 308 can do "double duty". *POLS 308 should be taken in the advance of upper level electives*.

TECHNOLOGY:

A technology course in the major can double count towards general education and major requirements. For example, POLS 350T or POLS 458T can do "double duty".

CORE COURSES:

Students should take POLS 100S, POLS 101S, and POLS 102 before enrolling in upper level courses. (STAT 130M and POLS 308 with a grade of C- or better in both courses is a prerequisite for POLS 418).

PUBLIC LAW:

It is recommended that students interested in public law take POLS 301W, 306, or 307 prior to the following 400-level courses: 403, 408, 409, 419, 421.

TOPICS COURSES: (395/396, 495/496):

Depending upon their content, these courses may be used to fulfill the requirements for courses in the various emphasis areas of Political Science. The advisor certifies, in writing, that the course counts for a given area.

PRACTICA OR INTERNSHIPS:

Three credits for an approved practicum may count towards the 36 hours of Political Science. Depending upon their content, a practicum or internship may be used to fulfill the requirements for courses in various emphasis areas of Political Science. The advisor certifies, in writing, that the course counts for a given area.

OTHER ELECTIVES:

United Nations I & II (POLS 320 and 321W), despite being 300-level courses, may be taken by freshman and sophomores.

HONORS IN POLITICAL SCIENCE (BA OR BS):

Students must meet the minimum standards of the honors program, including the overall GPA of 3.25. Students wishing honors designation in the major for Political Science fulfill all requirements for the given degree, BA or BS, and in addition, they must do the following (this does not increase the number of hours required for the major):

- a) Attain a GPA in the major of 3.5.
- b) Earn honors in nine (9) hours of courses in the major at the 300/400 level, with no more than six (6) hours taken from the same instructor. Independent study/internship courses are not eligible.
