After the answers/clarification were obtained, the subcommittee identified the following eight data sources/criteria to be used for completing the academic program rubric questions.

- Impact on students
- Academic quality
- Program enrollment
- Credit hours and degrees conferred
- Unit spending
- Dean's response
- Chair's response
- State demand

The subcommittee began their work by reviewing undergraduate programs in the two colleges. They will continue to meet to review the graduate programs and present their findings at an upcoming meeting.
